

NIGHT OF HOPE AT TRINITY, AUBURN

Well before the pandemic hit, Barna research—as well as others'—found that young people, namely Millennials and Gen Z, are more likely than past generations to report battling with mental health issues. In research conducted for The Connected Generation, Barna's largest-ever study, half of U.S. 18–35-year-olds (49%) reported feeling anxiety over important decisions and also expressed a fear of failing. Over three in 10 said they often felt sad or depressed (39%) or lonely and isolated from others (34%). The mental health strain teens and young adults were under pre-pandemic has only intensified during the crisis.




