Policy Regarding the Lord's Supper






⁶Yet among the mature we do impart wisdom, although it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to pass away. ⁷But we impart a secret and hidden wisdom of God, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. ⁸None of the rulers of this age understood this, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. ⁹But, as it is written,

"What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him"—

¹⁰these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. ¹¹For who knows a person's thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. ¹²Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God. ¹³And we impart this in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual truths to those who are spiritual.

¹⁴The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned. ¹⁵The spiritual person judges all things, but is himself to be judged by no one. ¹⁶"For who has understood the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?" But we have the mind of Christ.

Mary-Martha will be collecting items for the Beyond the NICU program at HSHS St. John's Hospital. - Ministry Centers in over 50 countries around the world. LHM finds people that can be trained in a foreign Country. They already know the customs, the language, and the culture of their Country.
- Sat 7 A ministry that can beam the Christian message into Muslim Countries that won't allow Christians or even Bibles into their Country.
- THRED A internet connection that reaches teens where they are in the media. A blog where Christians can discuss issues. There is a Lutheran Pastor on that blog.
- Check out LHM.com to learn more.
