Stores have school supplies on sale, so in September we will be gathering items for School Kits. Items needed to complete kits we have started are the following:

- 4 -70 sheet notebooks (wide or college ruled) for each kit
- 1- 30 centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 box of 16 or 24 Crayola Crayons
- 1 2 1/2" pink eraser
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 small blunt scissor

It costs LWR about \$2.25 to ship each School Kit overseas, so you may make a monetary donation for shipping costs if you are not a shopper.

You can still furnish items for any of the other kits at any time. We are in need of sturdy combs, nail clippers, cloth diapers, baby shirts, sleepers (no feet,) jackets with a hood and gowns.

Last month we shipped 10 quilts and 29 School Kits to LWR and we have 11 more School kits packed and ready to be shipped. If you have items to donate they may be taken to church and placed in the box by the office door or left in the office with Joanne. Our goal is 50 School Kits, (or more)!! Thank you so much for your continued support to these projects.

FROM PASTOR PAUL

Hope comes. Hope can be lost. How hope grows among any people is determined to some degree by how that people uses its gifts. But because circumstances often demand and push us to use our gifts in new and creative ways, a prior, more important decision may very well be whether we will use our gifts and talents at all. In case anyone may have forgotten, let me remind you that every one of us has a place of service to be filled, a gift to give, a witness to proclaim. Some, like Peter and Paul, may do their proclaiming in the limelight. My guess is that most of us do what we do in the background, out-of-sight, quietly but enormously useful. The point is this: ALL are needed.

We are people of faith. That might be to otherwise say we have something to hope in. But faith doesn't just orient one toward the future. It ought also inspire us to be radical change agents of Christ where we live right here, right now. Each one of us needs to be asking ourselves daily, "What is it that Jesus would have me do with the gifts he has given me so that we can have hope not only for tomorrow but for THIS DAY, as well?" Said Thomas Carlyle, "In the final analysis, our main business is not to see what lies dimly at a distance, but to do what lies clearly at hand."

You don't have to be at the pinnacle to make a contribution. We all need to have you right where you are, digging in, doing what God has called you to do and be. Anthropologists report that in certain primitive tribes in South America, the most important community role is that of the "keeper of the flame." Fire was so important to the community's life and well-being that only the most trusted members of the village were given the responsibility. All during the night the "keeper of the flame" added wood to the fire, keeping it alive while the rest of the members of the community slept.

Let that picture lean against you through the month of September. It is not an exaggeration to say that every one of us is the keeper of some flame. How brightly burns the light of Christ in and around St. John is in no little way dependent upon the work we all do together, and that depends upon whether each one of us responds to our respective callings.

Thank you for your continued partnership in ministry through St. John.



Support Group is a peer-led support group for family members, caregivers and


loved ones of individuals living with mental illness.
