2019-2020 Spring Enrollment Forms - Enrollment forms went out in the mail on Monday, February 11. Enrollment forms are to be returned to the school no later than March 1. There is a \$100 late fee for enrollment forms returned to the school after March 1. If you did not receive yours by Saturday, February 16, please call the school office right away.

**Preschool has a maximum class size of 12 students per class.

Prekindergarten has a maximum class size of 14 students per morning and afternoon class. The Preschool and Prekindergarten programs fill up fast so DO NOT delay in returning an application for enrollment once you receive one.

LWML Scholarships for College Students - Applications are now available for \$500 scholarships for the 2019-2020 academic year awarded through the LWML Indiana District Scholarship Fund. A limited number of scholarships are given to students preparing for full-time church work in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. Students must demonstrate a need for financial assistance, have a good scholastic aptitude and be enrolled in an LCMS college or seminary. Applicants need to be a communicant member of an LCMS Indiana District congregation for at least eighteen months prior to applying for a scholarship. Applications are posted on the Indiana District LWML website – under Resources, then Applications and Forms.
