As We Gather...

On Transfiguration Sunday this past March, our Sunday School children helped us bid farewell to our "alleluias" in preparation for the penitential season of Lent by processing their "Alleluia Banners" out of the church. Now, having faithfully prepared throughout the Lenten season to keep the Feast of Easter in spirit and in truth, our alleluias return with joy as we hear the blessed news: "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!" Lent, and Holy Week particularly with the Service of Corporate Confession and Absolution on Holy (Maundy) Thursday, have served as an extended preparation for the feast of Easter, bringing us to repent of our sins and trust in our crucified and risen Lord who distributes His blood-bought forgiveness here in God's house. Because Lent is such an extended preparation for the celebration of Christ's resurrection on this Easter Day, no rite of preparation (such as Confession and Absolution) is necessary to this festive Divine Service. Thus, the Service moves immediately to the altar during the Processional Hymn and proceeds with the Introit, the formal beginning of the Service of the Word.

Almighty God, by Your Holy Word throughout the Lenten season You have prepared our hearts and minds faithfully to keep this feast of Easter in spirit and in truth. As we now gather to hear the joyful news that by the glorious resurrection of Your Son, Jesus Christ, You destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light, we ask that You bless the hearing of Your Word, so that we who have been crucified and raised with Christ in the waters of Holy Baptism may abide in His presence and rejoice in the hope of eternal glory; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. 
THE WORDS OF OUR LORD (Words of Institution)
