Today's Light Bible Study -Week 85: Acts 13 - 23. Saul. who is now also called Paul (the Roman form of the Hebrew name Saul), starts his first missionary journey after 13 years as a Christian. His journey is successful in converting Gentiles, but is frustrated by rejection of both the Jews and unbelieving Gentiles. Two years after his first, Paul begins his 2nd missionary journey. Paul was imprisoned for his teachings during this journey, but when the authorities learned he was a Roman citizen, he was released. Paul's preaching continues to anger those opposed to Jesus Christ. A year after his 2nd journey, Paul begins his 3rd missionary journey. In this journey, Paul travels to Jerusalem. Like Stephen, Paul preaches before the same Council (the same as that which crucified Jesus), angers them, and to save his life, is transferred from Jerusalem to Caesarea (the Roman capital of Judea).
