Fourth Grade Academics	
Religion	Enable students to grow in their faith, focus on Law, Gospel, forgiveness, repentance, confession, grace, daily prayer and worship
Language Arts	Grammar, word usage, mechanics of writing, compositions: persuasive, comparisons, fables, poetry, letter writing, personal narratives
Math	Build on basic skills, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, geometry, decimals, fractions, graphs, metric system, money, time
Science	Life, earth, physical and health sciences studied through hands-on experiments
Social Studies	Geographical regions of the United States, geography, history, economy
Music	Develop music theory through learning to play the recorder
Computers	Keyboard skills, word processing skills
