Eighth Grade Academics

Religion	Study of the six main parts of <i>Luther's Small Catechism</i>
Language Arts	Short stories, nonfiction, Greek mythology, folktales, fables, legends, biographies, novel units, grammar as applied to writing
Math	Operations with rational numbers, variables, expressions and functions, linear equations, inequalities, roots, exponents, ration, proportion, percent, statistics, graphs, probability, geometry
Science	Study of physical science: physics and chemistry
Social Studies	American history from the formation of the 13 colonies to the end of the Civil War and Reconstruction
Music	Exploration of the fundamentals of music and its application in the human experience
Art	Exploration of the basic elements of art: line, shape, movement, color, value, texture, variety, space, proportion, repetition, pattern, balance
Computers	File management, keyboarding, Microsoft Office
