FROM PASTOR BREWER

Probably the simplest way to describe the month of December is the word expectation. December is filled with expectations by young and old. Expectations of gifts under the Christmas tree for the young, building to the point that the last few days before Christmas are almost unbearable for them and their parents who hear them begging to open at least one gift. Expectations to see family for many of the old, where December is a joyous time when children and grandchildren come home one of the few times each year to crowd together in their home again and celebrate the days gone by. But December is a month of expectation for a very different reason also, the season of Advent.

The expectation we feel in Advent is highlighted by Isaiah the prophet in chapter 9:2-6, "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest, as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder. For as in the day of Midian's defeat, you have shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor. Every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood will be destined for burning, will be fuel for the fire. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

And 40:3-5, "A voice of one calling: "In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

And 12:2-6, Surely God is my salvation; I will trust and not be afraid. The LORD, the LORD himself, is my strength and my defense; he has become my salvation." With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. In that day you will say: "Give praise to the LORD, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done, and proclaim that his name is exalted. Sing to the LORD, for he has done glorious things; let this be known to all the world. Shout aloud and sing for joy, people of Zion, for great is the Holy One of Israel among you."

But the greatest example of the expectation in Advent comes from Mary the mother of our Lord who says in Luke 1:46-55, And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed for the Mighty One has done great things for me— holy is his name His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."

The last sentence captures the heart of the meaning of Advent, "He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, <u>just as he promised our ancestors.</u>" As God has kept His promises in the past, so He will keep His promises for the future. As Jesus fulfilled the promise of the Messiah that would come to restore God's people from the destruction that sin, death and the devil had wrought upon them, so will Jesus come again to finally put all things in subjection under Himself and recreate a new heaven and earth where there will be no more sin, death and the devil. Advent is a season of preparation that uses expectation to prepare us for the Savior that not only has come and fulfilled God's promise to us, but will come again to bring it all to completion.

On a completely different not I wanted to circle back to my newsletter article from last month and remind you of the changes coming in the new year with ChurchConnect. We are rolling out another option for communication and information for the congregation called ChurchConnect. This app will also be how online giving will be done starting January 1, 2024. You will need to log in to Vanco, our current online giving provider and have your offerings stop at the end of 2023. And then set up your new online giving through the ChurchConnect app with Swipe.

In order to utilize ChurchConnect you will need to set up a user account in it. You can go to https://stjohnlux.churchtrac.com/sign-in and click on the **Create An Account** button to create your account. Your information is already in the ChurchTrac database system and will be associated with the login you create. You can update your information as needed from there.


