
SOUTHERN ILLINOIS DISASTER RESPONSE (LERT):

The Disaster Response Program within the LCMS-SID continues to grow with blessings from our Lord and Savior. There have been Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) and chainsaw trainings in a number of our district congregations. Murphysboro was blessed with a matching grant from the LCMS, and the LWML and have purchased and equipped a disaster response trailer. Trained SID members have responded to natural disasters in a number of communities within the LCMS; hurricanes in Panama City, Fl,; New Orleans, LA; Sulfur, LA; tornadoes in Onalaska, TX; northeast Alabama; Selma AL; Little Rock, AR; Chester, IL; flooding in Beaumont, TX; Alton, IL; and Eureka, MO and a derecho in Cedar Rapids, IA.

As our response that brings God's love to his people in times of disaster continues to grow, so also does our need for equipment and volunteers. The need for equipment to remove debris and trees from affected homes and property is great.

The SID Board of Directors has approved an effort to raise funds for a stand on skid steer with a grapple bucket. The cost of a new machine is approximately \$40,000. The LCMS Disaster Response Program has agreed to provide a matching grant of \$20,000 for this purchase. A trailer to haul the skid steer is also needed. The SID need for the trailer and skid steer is \$35,000. Please prayerfully consider assisting the SID Disaster Response Program in this need, both as a congregation and as individual members of the SID.
