- Pre-K (3- and 4-year-olds) meetings scheduled. Teachers continue to prepare for classes.

Motion made, seconded, and approved to accept the principal's report.

School Treasurer's Report: In the absence of school treasurer Martha Polczynski, Mark Sachtleben presented the T-SJ school treasurer's report showing a negative balance of \$-10,868.45. With the addition of new staff, the budget is tight. Motion made, seconded, and approved the adjustment to the T-SJ budget due to TSJ salary changes. Monthly payment increased \$1876.43; from \$12,058.86 to \$13,935.29. It is expected to correct itself with tuition payments. Motion made, seconded, and approved to accept the School Treasurer's report.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Treasurer Andi Hoffman reported \$12,729.23 General account budget deficit and \$2290 synod budget deficit. The first quarter checking account balance is \$20,010.69. Endowment funds have been invested. Motion made, seconded, and approved the Treasurer's report.

Finance Board: Nothing to report.

Elder's Report /Pastor's Report: The radio bible study will need donors soon. 'Christ Our Song Lutheran School of Music' has 2 individuals to help: Pastor Eichhorn and Mike Trinklein.Saturday evening Communion distribution will go back to pre-COVID guidelines. Pastor Hans Trinklein may no longer need Missionary funds; we are awaiting further information. Jill Witte has been granted permission to have a blood drive. It will be August 23 from 2 – 6 p.m. in the schoolhouse basement. Pastor Mueller thanked the Members of the school board for their diligence in dealing with the staffing challenges at T-SJ. Prison Ministry is going well. Mural for Debra Lange is complete. Some donations are still needed to cover the \$3500 cost. She served at T-SJ for 31 years. Motion made, seconded, and approved the purchase of a bookshelf and small library of books to be placed under the pavilion near the basketball courts in memory of Deb Lange.. GriefShare is going well. New GriefShare videos will be purchased using a Thrivent community impact grant gift card. Since the Thrivent card will not cover the whole amount, Becky Brinkmann approved monies from the Zach Brinkmann Memorial fund. Motion made, seconded, and approved. Pastor Mueller is looking for donations to cover the cost of 25 copies of the Lutheran Study Bible to be taken on a Mission trip to Uganda. If

more than is needed is collected, the extra funds will be used in some other way to support the work of training pastors in Uganda. Pastor Mueller requested a *Release of Duty* for 18 days (January 25 – February 11, 2024).
