"REACHING IN" PILOT PROGRAM

This information from the District LWML President describes the program that Pastor Jeff Nehrt will talk about after both services today.

Since early this spring, exciting plans have been taking hold here in the Southern Illinois District concerning the *Reaching In* LCMS Prison Ministry Program. The vision of the *Reaching In* is "to increase the sharing of the Gospel in jails and prisons by implementing the *Reaching In* model." This model is a multi-faceted approach which involves communicating with incarcerated men and women through pastors, teachers, and layperson mentors who share Bibles, LCMS reviewed Bible studies, devotions, *Portals of Prayer*, and *Luther's Small Catechism* with individuals who request these items. More about this program can be found in the brochure that is included as an attachment with this letter.

For the past two years, the COVID pandemic has hindered the men and women who serve in SID prison ministry as prison facilities have been on lockdown to help prevent the spread of the virus and its variants. Pastors and others involved in the prison ministry programs in Illinois and throughout the United States have had few opportunities to enter prison facilities to share the Gospel with men and women who are incarcerated. Early this spring, Pastor Jeff Nehrt, LCMS SID Prison Ministry, spoke to me as LWML SID President about the need for mentors to "reach in" to our prisons via the USPS so that the sharing of the Gospel might continue in a meaningful way in spite of the lockdowns.

Since this initial conversation, it is exciting to report our awesome God has been moving in wonderful ways to enable this program. Here's what's been happening:

• Agreements have been reached to be able to provide a pilot program in the prisons in our district.

- Following a presentation by Pastor Nehrt to the LWML SID Board of Directors, LWML SID has offered both prayers and needed financial support to provide the Lutheran materials necessary for this program.
- Lutheran Braille Workers will print the large print Bibles and other needed large print materials and will be able to send them free of charge into the prisons to those who request them via a U.S. Library of Congress program for the visually impaired. Why large print materials? In many prisons, men and women who are incarcerated are not allowed to wear eyeglasses as they can be fashioned into weapons. Large print materials are therefore essential for reading.
- An advertising poster for the program has been developed for display in the prisons. This poster shares the words of Matthew 28:20, [Jesus said,] "I am with you always, to the end of the age." It also proclaims the truth: "You are not alone. Christ is here for you."
- A postcard has been developed for men and women who are incarcerated to use to request a free large print Bible, catechism, and a Bible study from Lutheran Braille Workers. Another postcard has been designed for these men and women to use to request a mentor who will help guide them through the Bible and study materials and to provide Christ-centered support.

So here's where you come in. To get this program in place, mentors are needed to communicate with men and women in our district prisons who are serious about hearing the Gospel. The LCMS SID Prison Ministry Team is looking for men and women, still working or retired, to serve as these mentors. A large group of men and women are needed to serve who have a big heart for sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. These mentors could be pastors, Lutheran school teachers, and others who have a strong understanding of how to present the Law and Gospel in ways which center on Christ and on His saving love offered to all. You can be assured that no personal information of any mentor will be shared with any of the men and women who are incarcerated or with any prison workers. A program is being developed where requests and communications from those men and women would be sent to a secure post office box in our district. The information would then be collected and scanned by volunteers and sent to the mentors so that communication can begin. All communication would take place in this secure way.

St. John Lutheran Church, New Minden Quarterly Voter's Meeting-October 26, 2023

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Dean Sprehe with 24 members present. Pastor Mueller began the meeting with opening devotion from Philippians Chapter 1 and prayer. Minutes from the previous meeting were approved as read. A Report on the fall Festival was added to the agenda under New Business.

Principal's Report: Mrs. Diane Backs, Assistant Principal shared the following:

- Mrs. Laurie Eubanks fills in when Mrs. Deitt Schneider or Mrs. Diane Backs are not available.
- Theme for the academic school year is "God is our guard."
- Enrollment of 113 for Pre-K thru 8th grade. Trinity 60; St. John 14; Other 39.
- First day of attendance was August 15, 2023
- Reviewed staffing with no current open positions. The School Board continues to work on calling a principal.
- Over \$1,000 was received after the recent Savers drive.
- Sports are making the transition to basketball.
- Field trips and fundraisers continue.
- Technology upgrades as the result of a grant.

Motion made, seconded, and approved to accept the principal's report.

School Treasurer's Report: Martha Polczynski presented the T-SJ school treasurer's report showing a balance of \$40,377.60. Motion made, seconded, and approved the School Treasurer's report. Martha also requested a motion to approve spending from the Building fund to pay for upgrades deemed necessary after the Accreditation visit. This requires approval from both congregations. Per Clinton Dunn recommendation from the School Board; motion made, seconded, and approved this request.

<u>School Board:</u> Clinton Dunn presented the proposed T-SJ school budget for 2024. The budget assumes a tuition increase of 10% and an annual average raise of 3.5% for staff. Overall, the budget will increase by approximately \$40,000. St. John's monthly payment will \$12,845.85. This amount is down \$1,100 from what St. John has been paying for the last 5 months of 2023. Motion made, seconded, and approved the T-SJ 2024 budget.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Treasurer Andi Hoffman reported a deficit in the Receipts collections of approximately \$24,000. Synod collections have a deficit of nearly \$3,700. The current checking account balance is \$8,100.58. Motion made, seconded, and approved the Treasurer's report. The proposed church budget will be presented in January.

Finance Board: Nothing to report.

Elder's Report: Nothing to report.

Pastor's Report:

- The radio bible study needs donors.
- Pastor Hans Trinklein has been installed as a Professor at Concordia, Nebraska.
- Prison ministry is going well.
- Grief Share has new materials and will resume in November.
- Appreciates the support for the Uganda mission trip/books.
- Christ Our Song Lutheran School of Music has several taking piano lessons.

• The school year is going well with the Interim administration.

CORLHS has several international students, and the Sterling evening event was a success.

Responsibilities as Vacancy Pastor at Olive Branch & Venedy will end November 30th.

Pastor Jeff Nehrt from Greenville will preach at New Minden on November 12th.

Third quarter statistics: Baptized members 355, Communicant members 290, Sunday School 10, Sunday adult Bible Class 12. Through the first three quarters: Sunday service 95, Saturday service 17, Weekend 98 (pre-Covid attendance was 99 per weekend), 166 communed at least once. One wedding Eric Hemminghaus and Kimberly Hartman. Motion made, seconded, and approved Pastor Mueller's report.

Trustees: Nothing to report.

Historical society: Offered appreciation for all the volunteer hours.

New Business: Robert Langrehr shared a preliminary report on the Fall Festival; approximately \$5,671 (approximately \$3600 before donations). He thanked Terry Lange for lining up volunteer workers and asked that next year the Finance board take the money home after the stand closed for the evening.
