CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Let there be no filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place, but instead let there be thanksgiving. Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. 


What can I apply to my life?

In this service for Week 1 of Lent, we remember that Christ calls us to be salt and light in this world of sin (*Matthew 5:13-16*). We who have tasted and seen his great love for us on the cross can spend our Lent savoring his salvation and shining with his glory and grace in the places where he has put us.
