This is a very special day at St. John: we celebrate our youth who will participate in the Rite of Confirmation, also called a “Public Affirmation of Baptism and Faith.” *What does this mean?* In Baptism God the Father brings us into His family through Jesus Christ. We are now His children and given the gift of faith through the Holy Spirit. Most are baptized as an infant through the loving authority of their parents. The rite of confirmation then is the opportunity for an individual to publicly confess, with their own voice, that Jesus is their Lord and Savior and, with the help of God, commit to following Christ—even unto death. After confessing Jesus as their Lord and Savior, our youth are invited to the Lord’s Table to receive, with all believers, the body and blood of Christ that will continue to nurture and sustain their faith. Today is also an opportunity for each us to renew our faith and join together in the ongoing ministry of the Body of Christ. “And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.” (Philippians 1:6)

Acts 2:14a, 36–41

Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, . . .

HOLY GOSPEL

John 21:1–19

After this Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and he revealed himself in this way. Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said to them, “I am going fishing.” They said to him, “We will go with you.” They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, “Children, do you have any fish?” They answered him, “No.” He said to them, “Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some.” So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, because of the quantity of fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved therefore said to Peter, “It is the Lord!” When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work, and threw himself into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off.

When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire in place, with fish laid out on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, “Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.” So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, 153 of them. And although there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, “Come and have breakfast.” Now none of the disciples dared ask him, “Who are you?” They knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, “Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?” He said to him, “Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.” He said to him, “Feed my lambs.” He said to him a second time, “Simon, son of John, do you love me?” He said to him, “Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.” He said to him, “Tend my sheep.” He said to him the third time, “Simon, son of John, do you love me?” Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, “Do you love me?” and he said to him, “Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.” Jesus said to him, “Feed my sheep. Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were young, you used to dress yourself and walk wherever you wanted, but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will dress you and carry you where you do not want to go.” (This he said to show by what kind of death he was to glorify God.) And after saying this he said to him, “Follow me.”

TEACHING FROM GOD'S WORD

“I'm Going Fishing.”: *John 21:15-19*

† RITE OF CONFIRMATION †

Our confirmands come forward to profess the faith given to them through Baptism, by the Holy Spirit, and now confessed with their own voice before the congregation.

- P** Jesus said, “Whoever confesses Me before men, I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven. But whoever denies Me before men, I will also deny before My Father who is in heaven.” Lift up your hearts, therefore, to the God of all grace and joyfully give answer to what I now ask you in the name of the Lord:

CONFESION OF FAITH

- P** Do you this day in the presence of God and of this congregation acknowledge the gifts that God gave you in your Baptism?
- R** *Yes, I do.*
- P** Do you renounce the devil, all his works and all his ways?
- R** *Yes, I renounce them.*
- P** Do you believe in God, the Father?
- R** *Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.*
- P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ?
- R** *Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.*
- P** Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
- R** *Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.*
- P** Do you hold all the prophetic and apostolic Scriptures to be the inspired Word of God?
- R** *I do.*
- P** Do you confess the teachings of the Lutheran Church, as you have learned them from the Small Catechism, to be faithful and true to God’s Word?
- R** *I do.*
- P** Do you intend to hear the Word of God and receive the Lord’s Supper faithfully?
- R** *I do, by the grace of God.*
- P** Do you intend to live according to the Word of God, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, even to death?
- R** *I do, by the grace of God.*
- P** Do you intend to continue steadfast in the Christian faith and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?
- R** *I do, by the grace of God.*

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

As a Christian, given the gift of faith in our baptism, we are called by God to share with the world the story of Jesus and how He has changed our lives.

- What are some ways you can share your faith with others today?
- Sometimes we don’t know what to say or how to say it when asked about our faith in Jesus. What can help is to prepare our “story” of Jesus in our lives before we are asked.
 - Think of a time in your life that you felt the presence of God or saw Him at work in your life.
 - We all have favorite Bible verses – is there one that goes with your story?
 - Put these together can come up with an “elevator speech” – something you can share in 1-2 minutes that tells of your faith in Jesus.
