CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

1 John 1:8-9; John 20:19-23

- **P** If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

BAPTISMAL ADDRESS

Matthew 28:18b-19; Mark 16:16a; 1 Peter 3:21

P Dearly beloved, Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." In the last chapter of Mark our Lord promises, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." And the apostle Peter has written, "Baptism now saves you." The Word of God also teaches that we are all conceived and born sinful and are under the power of the devil until Christ claims us as His own. We would be lost forever unless delivered from sin, death, and everlasting condemnation. But the Father of all mercy and grace has sent His Son Jesus Christ, who atoned for the sin of the whole world, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.

SIGN OF THE CROSS

Receive the sign of the holy cross both upon your + forehead and upon your + heart to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.

ADDRESS TO SPONSORS

- From ancient times the Church has observed the custom of appointing sponsors for baptismal candidates. In the Evangelical Lutheran Church sponsors are to confess the faith expressed in the Apostles' Creed and taught in the Small Catechism. 
BLESSING OF THE NEWLY BAPTIZED & BAPTISMAL CANDLE

- **C** We do so promise.
- Do you promise to give these new members your support as brothers and sisters in Christ and to use your resources to meet their needs of body, mind, and spirit that we may be built up in the Lord together (Eph 4:12)? If so, then answer:
- **C** We do so promise, with the help of God.

To the New Members

- Dur Lord Jesus Christ bids us to confess Him before men, with the promise that He will then confess us before His Father in heaven. Romans 10:9-10 state, "That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. We welcome you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. May God richly bless all of us as we continue in His work and mission all the days of our life. Amen.


