The Rev. John Pingel of West Seneca, NY was elected to his first term as president of the LCMS Eastern District at the district's 100th convention, held June 17-18 in Tonawanda, NY. He succeeds the Rev. Dr. Chris Wicher on Sept. 1, 2022, who is retiring after serving four

terms as district president. Pingel was elected on the second ballot.

Since 2010, Pingel has served as the pastor of Salem Lutheran Church in Buffalo, NY. Since 2015, he has served as the First Vice President/Buffalo Regional Vice President, and has served on the Eastern District Board of Directors. He is married to Diane (Giddens) for 30 years.
