**FROM THE PARISH NURSE -
February is Healthy Heart Month: :**



There are many steps you can take to keep your heart healthy.

Try to be more physically active. Talk with your doctor about the type of activities that would be best for you. If possible, aim to get at least 150 minutes of physical activity each week. Every day is best. It doesn't have to be done all at once.

Start by doing activities you enjoy—brisk walking, dancing, bowling, bicycling, or gardening, for example. Avoid spending hours every day sitting. This exercise and physical activity campaign from the National Institute on Aging (NIA) has exercises, motivational tips, and free video and print materials. Go4Life is designed to help you fit exercise and physical activity into your daily life.

If you smoke, quit. Smoking is the leading cause of preventable death. Smoking adds to the damage to artery walls. It's never too late to get some benefit from quitting smoking. Quitting, even in later life, can lower your risk of heart disease, stroke, and cancer over time.

Follow a heart-healthy diet. Choose foods that are low in trans and saturated fats, added sugars, and salt. As we get older, we become more sensitive to salt, which can cause swelling in the legs and feet. Eat plenty of fruits, vegetables, and foods high in fiber, like those made from whole grains. Get more information on healthy eating from NIA. You also can find information on the Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension (DASH) eating plan and the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Patterns.

Keep a healthy weight. Balancing the calories you eat and drink with the calories burned by being physically active helps to maintain a healthy weight. Some ways you can maintain a healthy weight include limiting portion size and being physically active. Learn more about how to maintain a healthy weight from NIA. Keep your diabetes, high blood pressure, and/or high cholesterol under control. Follow your doctor's advice to manage these conditions, and take medications as directed.

January 9, 2020

Confirmation Update: Brian Rodenberg shared his report about the fall confirmation class. He thanked Diane for all of her help. He thought the curriculum Pastor Anderson left was helpful. Brian reported that all six students attended every session. There is a concern for some who have a small number of sermon notes.

Call to Order: President Craig Tuecke called the meeting to order at 7:11 pm.

Devotions and Prayers: Pastor Harbaugh shared the history and challenges of the early ministry as experienced by Peter and Paul in the 10th chapter of Acts. He emphasized that Christ's resurrection is the centerpiece of our faith.

Secretary's Report: The council reviewed the minutes of the last meeting. MSC to approve the minutes of the December 12, 2019 meeting as published.

The council reviewed the Treasurer's Report. MSC to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Harbaugh shared his moving plans and the cost (\$2012). He felt things went well last weekend. Pastor Harbaugh emphasized the importance of the Lord's Supper. He asked for our prayers as we start out. Pastor Harbaugh said he is available when someone needs a pastor and shared his phone number: 563-412-8904.

Outreach Ministries: Nancy Heitman had nothing new to report.

Educational Ministries: Stephanie Thomas reported that all went well with the Christmas program. She shared that the Vacation Bible School curriculum, Rocky Railway: Jesus' Power Pulls Us Through, is in.

Children and Youth Ministries: Lynda Akers reminded us that the Lock In scheduled for January 24, 2020. There will be a minimum of 8 participants. Lynda is sending a letter out to our middle school students.

Public Relations Ministries: Chuck Hemann discussed the scam of having St. John's as the Best Place of Worship in Guttenberg, that is, if we pay for it! Chuck is working on new art work for the sign. He will share a welcome to Pastor Harbaugh with the Guttenberg Press.

Stewardship Ministries: Michele VonHandorf was absent. Craig shared that the Scrip sales during the holiday season were very good.

Worship and Music Ministries: Carolyn Hoffmann reported that her committee met with Pastor Harbaugh tonight. The Golden Oldies service and soup dinner will be on February 23rd. The committee discussed Lenten services and the Holden Evening Prayer led by the choir. They will finalize plans at a later date. Pastor Harbaugh will be giving Children's Sermons in January, March, and April

on the Sundays the Sunday School sings. We were informed that all prayers will be read from the lectern.

Property Ministries: Don Schmelzer was absent. With Don training for a new job, Harold Heitman has stepped in to help especially with all of the work at the parsonage.

Parish Fellowship: Mary Lou Harbaugh was absent.

Vice President: Mary Streich had nothing new to report.

Old Business:

Head Usher/Communion Assistants: Assignments were made for Saturday services for the next month.

Parsonage Update: Craig reported that the furnace was inspected and found to have a cracked heat exchanger. A new furnace was purchased and installed. The water heater, washer, dryer, stove/oven are in good condition. In the interest of safety, two carbon dioxide detectors and three smoke detectors were installed. In the future, the upstairs bathroom shower stall will need to be replaced. The garage door opener is 23 years old. A universal control was purchased. Midland Door of Dyersville would charge \$209 to replace the motor, \$37 for two remotes, and \$51 for the keypad for a total of \$402. We discussed replacing instead of repairing. Chuck Hemann offered to donate a unit he has complete with remotes and keypad. It would need to be installed. We really appreciate this generous donation. Craig also thanked Harold and Nancy Heitman for the help they gave in preparing the parsonage prior to Pastor and Mrs. Harbaugh moving in.

Matthew 28 Distribution: We won't know until February if there will be a distribution from this fund. Jim will keep us informed.

Budget: The proposed 2020 budget was reviewed. MSC to approve the proposed 2020 budget.

Narthex Christmas Tree: Although the tree looked good during the Christmas season, there were many extension cords running through the tree. This is a safety issue. The tree was used for eight years even though it had only a three year guarantee. During the set up and dismantling, a 16 foot ladder had to be used. The tree had to be put down on the floor to get it apart. Mary reported that a new tree was purchased at a 75% discount and additional 12% business discount for a final cost of \$192.63. MSC to discontinue the use of the current Christmas tree due to the electrical issues and lack of stability which are both safety issues.

New Business:

Post Prom Donation: MSC to donate \$25.00 to the Post Prom.

Audit: Anna Moser reconciled the books and did a year end reconciliation in lieu of an audit. We agreed that that it was a wise move to do it professionally. This only involved the General Fund. The small group books still need to be done. Diane will check to see if Peoples State Bank will do them.

Keys: Lynda Akers asked if she could keep her door key to use for activities such as the lock in. It was the consensus that she could have a door key similar to the Boy Scouts.

Adjournment: Meeting adjourned at 8:38 pm. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Greetings...Winter has finally arrived! As a reminder, the SOTH Annual Conference Assembly will be held in a couple weeks – February 16, 2020 at Zion Lutheran Church, Oelwein at 2:00pm. Weather Date – February 23, same location & time. Will be reviewing our Synod Profile and Calling A Bishop documents in preparation for the Synod Assembly in June. We look forward to this time of fellowship and catching up with Conference News.

I recently volunteered for another Poverty Simulation to assist with training of Northeast Iowa Community Action team members. The first time I went through the training, I participated as a “Family Member”, gathering insight into the struggles a less fortunate family goes through regularly. This time, I was on the “Agency” side, as a Utility Company Collector. My job was to accept payments for monthly utilities (gas, electric & phone) and hand out disconnect notices, for unpaid utilities. A stat that was given at the Simulation, stated that upwards of 10% of individuals living in Clayton County are at poverty level or near poverty level. I highly suggest anyone in a leadership role or anyone wanting insight into the struggles, relating to poverty or near poverty in Clayton County & surrounding areas, attend a public session when available. You will see firsthand what families may go through monthly, working minimum wage jobs, healthcare or unexpected expenses, job loss, fixed budgets such as social security, daycare, food insecurities, etc.
