Dear Friends,

Everywhere I look it is WHITE. With another 3 inches of snow the other night, I have had my share of the white stuff. And now comes the warmer weather—water, slush and mud. Driving through a rather deep spot of water yesterday, I wonder, “Where is all this going?” The past few years, we have seen flooding in different parts of Northeastern Iowa—with destruction of homes and property. How can we help? Good question. And one with an easy answer.

A couple of months ago someone asked, “What good does our Synod do?” While I will not get into details, I will give a wonderful example of how working with churches our synod has made a great impact on local lives. Flood buckets. Churches fill a five-gallon bucket with cleaning supplies—which then get stored by the synod. When an emergency happens, the synod digs into their stash. People like you are able to use these materials to help clean their houses of mud, debris and mold.

So here is the challenge. I will place a number of buckets in the narthex of our church with clothespins—each containing a name of a item to be purchased. Most of these items can be purchased at the local dollar store. It can be a family project. A class project. A personal project. A couple of years ago, my congregation filled twenty buckets in a matter of a month. We will also put forth the option of donating a monetary gift that would cover items for a single bucket.

Included in this newsletter is an insert listing the items—and I will personally get the buckets out as soon as possible. One catch—the items must match the description—so that they will fit into the bucket. For example, if a 20 oz container is needed—please do not purchase a 40 oz—everything is such that it fits exactly in a bucket.

As the snow continues to melt, please think of your fellow Iowans and be generous.

FROM OUR PARISH NURSE

March is Healthy Nutrition Month:

Here are some recommendations to promote healthy habits through nutrition: Use a variety of foods every day.

Fruit - 2 cups/day

Vegetables - 2 1/2 cups/day

Nonfat and low-fat dairy products - 3 cups/day

Whole-grain breads, cereal, pasta, starchy vegetables and beans - 6 ounces/day

Lean meat, skinless poultry, fish, eggs and nuts - 5 1/2 ounces/day

Eat foods low in fat, saturated fat and cholesterol. Limit daily fat intake to 25-35% of calories consumed and saturated fat intake to less than 10% of daily calories. Avoid trans-fat as much as possible. Aim for the majority of fat intake to come from the fats," which are monounsaturated and polyunsaturated fat. These fats are found in nuts, seeds, fish and vegetable oils. Limit dietary cholesterol as a way to consume a healthy eating pattern. Eat moderate amounts of sugar. Limit added sugars to less than 10% of calories per day.

Read food labels and avoid foods with added sugar.

Eat sweet foods sparingly.

Eat a limited amount of salt and sodium.

Limit sodium intake to less than 2,300 mg a day. If you have high blood pressure, diabetes, chronic kidney disease, are African-American, or are 51 years and older, limit sodium intake to less than 1,500 mg a day. Remember: 1 teaspoon of salt = 2,400 mg. Season foods with garlic and fresh or dried herbs in place of salt. Keep the salt shaker off the table during meals to avoid adding salt.

Drink adequate amounts of water. Water is used by every system in the body, do adequate water intake is important for good health. Total water intake includes water from all fluids, including drinking water, other beverages (coffee, tea, juice, etc.), and foods with high water content, such as celery, tomatoes, broth soup and melons. The amount of water intake needed depends on the individual and their activity level, climate and health. Most people drink enough water by drinking when thirsty and with meals.

Exercise portion control. Use everyday items and your plate to calculate appropriate portion sizes.

1 oz is about the size of 4 dice

3 oz is about the size of a deck of cards

1 cup is about the size of a fist

1teaspoon about the size of a thumbnail tip

1/4 cup is about the size of a golf ball

2 Tablespoons is about the size of a large marshmallow.

Just a reminder, as a congregation we will continue to wear masks and continue with social distancing. As of the latest report, slightly more than 4% of Clayton County's population has been vaccinated against Covid 19, many of those vaccinations were provided right here at St. John's.

Make a Flood Bucket!



Flood buckets contain essential cleaning supplies to help people clean up their homes and businesses following a flooding disaster.

In 2017, the Northeast Iowa Synod's Disaster Response Network invited congregations to bring flood buckets to the 2017 Synod Assembly in Decorah. Congregations responded by bringing 150 flood buckets!

In addition, St. John Lutheran, Cedar Falls, donated 150 flood buckets to celebrate the congregation's 150th anniversary. Other congregations have also reached out to help neighboring communities affected by flooding.

Thank You!

The flood buckets have been stored at Glenwood Lutheran, Decorah; Grace Lutheran, Tripoli; and the Cerro Gordo County Emergency Management, Mason City.

In little more than a year, more than 200 of the buckets have been used for clean up after flooding in Sumner and Mason City.

You can help replenish the synod's supply of buckets, so that we can remain ready to respond when flooding occurs again in Northeastern Iowa.

HOW TO MAKE A FLOOD BUCKET

Each flood bucket must be assembled according to the instructions below, with all items listed. The value of each flood bucket is approximately \$60.

BUCKET CONTENTS:

- One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid (if bucket has been used, clean well but do not use if it has held chemicals of any kind.)
- Four scouring pads
- One scrub brush
- Five dust masks
- Seven sponges, assorted sizes (at least one fairly hefty for washing mold)
- 18 cleaning towels (reusable, like Easy Wipes®)
- One 12 oz. bottle of liquid concentrated household cleaner (like Lysol®)
- One 25 oz. bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn®)
- One 50 oz. or two 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- One package of 48-50 clothespins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- Two pairs latex gloves (long heavy-duty, like Playtex® dishwashing gloves, not the thin ones sold for painting etc.)
- One pair work gloves
- 28-bag roll of heavy-duty trash bags (30-45 gallon)

- One 6-9 oz. bottle of insect repellent (pump, drops or lotion, not aerosol)

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS:

All cleaning items must be new — all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened.

Place all items into the bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment. Snap the lid on tight and seal with packing tape.

Please Note: Do NOT substitute items, add items, or leave items out of the buckets. If the requested item size is not available, go down to the next available size.

Suggestions from Lutheran Disaster Response: Many items can be purchased at local dollar stores at a substantial savings. The Lysol cleaner can be difficult to find — be sure it is a concentrated formula.

If items are in boxes (like the trash bags), the box can be removed to conserve space in the bucket. Packaging from the dust masks can also be removed and the mask placed in a zip lock bag.

ADD A NOTE!

You are encouraged to add to the bucket a personal note wishing the user well, identifying the congregation where the bucket came from, etc.
This can be taped to the exterior of the bucket.

Wednesday, February 10, 2021

Call to Order: President Brian Rodenberg called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm.

Devotions and Prayers: Pastor Ashman read this week's Gospel from Mark, Chapter 9. Pastor reminded us of God's visions, dreams, and hopes. The church council members are called to do God's work using their special skills and talents. He reminded us that we need to ask God for insight and guidance.

Secretary's Report: The council reviewed the minutes of the last meeting. The minutes of the January 14, 2021 meeting stand approved as published noting the change in this month's meeting date.

The Treasurer's Report stands approved as presented.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ashman submitted a written report for the previous month to keep the Council updated on his activities. The report includes Saturday and Sunday worship, staff consultation, church council, office visits, phone calls, newsletter articles, First Communion organizational meeting, confirmation, continuing education, funeral, baptism, recording children's sermons, and helping with the Mobile Food Pantry. Pastor shared that he has planned a meeting for those wanting to take 1st Communion. He is planning Ash Wednesday and Lenten Services.

Outreach Ministries: Nancy Heitman shared that she is conducting her committee meetings via email. The committee is rotating months for members at the Care Center, Assisted Living, and homebound to receive a handwritten note. She said two people had donated note cards to this cause. They are also planning an Easter gift bag.

Educational Ministries: Stephanie Thomas reported that all is going well. She notified the city of the Vacation Bible School dates to avoid conflicts with swimming lessons. The Sunday School students made Valentine cards for our members at the Guttenberg Care Center.

Children and Youth Ministries: Forest Brown informed us that due to the extremely cold weather, the sledding party has been postponed. He is looking at February 21st or 28th as dates to reschedule. The sledding party will take place at the Brown's residence from 1:00 to 2:30. Forest will be meeting with his committee to plan this event.

Public Relations Ministries: Chuck Hemann reported that the new camera system is complete. With an additional part, the bugs that have been experienced should be resolved. Chuck shared that the city's video system is not compatible with the thumb drive we save our services on. It was suggested that we put a sign on the city's system to redirect interested viewers to our website to view the service.

Stewardship Ministries: Sherry Oliver will meet with her committee after the annual meeting. She reported that there are still a number of boxes of giving envelopes that need to be picked up or delivered. To mail these would cost about \$5.00 per box. Sherry is working on a schedule for those that volunteer to sell Scrip before and after our church services. She thanked Forest for taking on this task on Sunday morning.

Worship and Music Ministries: Mary Streich had nothing new to report. She will be meeting with her committee as soon as she can.

Property Ministries: Don Schmelzer was absent.

Parish Fellowship: Lorna Moser told us that her committee had distributed hot chocolate at the Mobile Food Pantry.

Vice President: Michele VonHandorf had nothing new to report.

Old Business:

Golden Oldies Service: The Golden Oldies Service has been scheduled for March 14, 2021. There will be two services at St. John's, 9:00 am and 10:15 am. Those planning to attend are asked to RSVP by calling the office.

Plumbing Update: The problems with the plumbing have been resolved. There was a snafu with the company the city hired to do work. A line that was not opened has been opened. The repairs will be the city's expense. Harold Heitmann was thanked for the work he did in getting in touch with the city.

Video Equipment Update: Now that the work has been completed the bill will be paid. The initial costs were paid with the Sophia Smith CD and designated memorials. The remaining \$1,217.20 will be paid from the Memorial Fund.

New Business:

Committee Goals: Pastor Mike asked all of the committees to set goals for this year, for next year, and for the following year. He shared that there is interest in a men's work trip. He suggested they plan something small such as in Dubuque to gain experience and then plan something farther away.

Piano Lamp: The piano lamp no longer works. We discussed the need to purchase a new one. MSC to allow Katie to select a new piano lamp not to exceed \$150.

Rescheduled Annual Meeting: Brian shared that the Annual Meeting has been rescheduled to February 21, 2021. The postcards have been sent out and announcements are being made in church per our constitution. The agenda will remain the same. We discussed video taping this portion of the service.

Ministry Coordinator Hiring Plan of Action: We discussed the information shared about the Ministry Coordinator position. The position would be 25 hours per week (5 hours/5 days a week) with a starting salary of \$19,000 - \$19,500. Brian is looking into the cost for a single insurance policy. We discussed the need for a background check, the timeline, and advertising. We set the application deadline for March 3, 2021 with interviews to follow on March 8 & 9, 2021. The new person would start April 1, 2021 with Diane training for one month. The council looked over the presented job advertisement and made suggestions to improve it. We discussed posting the advertisement on social media as well as in the newspaper. Brian and Diane clarified that the planning of the Mobile Food Pantry will be done by volunteers. The Ministry Coordinator will only do the data entry.

Post Prom Request: The council reviewed the annual Post Prom donation request. MSC to donate \$25.00 to support the Post Prom activities.

Adjournment: The meeting adjourned at 7:57 pm.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Regular Council Meeting: Mar. 11, 2021 at 7:00 pm.
