Dear Friends,

Peace to you from the Risen One. We are on the edge of finishing the programmed part of our year with Confirmation classes, Sunday School and Bible Studies coming to a close. With Summer ahead, the Council has been challenged with putting together both one year and three-year goals. Someone recently asked me what my goals are—made me think.

Here are some:

- 1) During the second half of my first year, I will continue to listen, evaluate—and even suggest some alternatives(yikes) in regards to our ministry as a whole. In a way, my challenge to the council is to try to focus on what we are trying to accomplish and why—and not just have a list of activities or actions.
- 2) To try my best to get out and visit with people in their homes, workplaces, restaurants, etc.—wherever people are the most comfortable. I was thinking of having a backyard picnic with a group of members—please bring lawn chairs—just to chat. I have yet to tell the boss about this one. Usually by this time, I have been into quite a few homes and done a lot of visiting--- the present conditions dictated otherwise.
- 3) To continue to work with the younger youth (with permission) to integrate them into the worship of the church. All too often we wait until confirmation age—and it turns into a list of “have to’s” and bargaining. I will reach out to parents to create a worship class for both 5th and 6th graders that would be voluntary—but would introduce them to the privilege of serving in worship.
- 4) As a three year goal, I would like to brainstorm with members and non-members about introducing some new dynamic ministries which fit the needs of our communities—rather than trying to fit people to what already exists. This would NOT undo our present ministry, but rather add possible additional dimensions where we can be the hands and feet of Jesus for even more people.
- 5) To continue to open up our work with our Northeast Iowa Synod so that we as a congregation are not simply members who invite them in when there is a problem. I have asked people from our Synod to come and speak—but also introduce us to various ministries such as the YAGM’s and the work with both the colleges and Wartburg Seminary.

That is probably more than enough to get me into trouble. I hope that you will continue to open your heart to the possibilities of ministry in our beautiful context. Blessings and Peace.

FROM OUR PARISH NURSE

May is Mental Health Awareness Month

This past year presented so many different challenges and obstacles that tested our strength and resiliency. The global pandemic forced us to cope with situations we never even imagined, and a lot of us struggled with our mental health as a result. The good news is that there are tools and resources available that can support the well-being of individuals and communities. Now, more than ever, we need to combat the stigma surrounding mental health concerns. That's why this Mental Health Month we are highlighting #Tools2Thrive - what individuals can do throughout their daily lives to prioritize mental health, build resiliency, and continue to cope with the obstacles of COVID-19.

Throughout the pandemic, many people who had never experienced mental health challenges found themselves struggling for the first time. During the month of May, we are focusing on different topics that can help process the events of the past year and the feelings that surround them, while also building up skills and supports that extend beyond COVID-19.

We know that the past year forced many to accept tough situations that they had little to no control over. If you found that it impacted your mental health, you aren't alone. In fact, of the almost half a million individuals that took the anxiety screening at MHAscreening.org, 79% showed symptoms of moderate to severe anxiety. However, there are practical tools that can help improve your mental health. We are focused on managing anger and frustration, recognizing when trauma may be affecting your mental health, challenging negative thinking patterns, and making time to take care of yourself.

It's important to remember that working on your mental health and finding tools that help you thrive takes time. Change won't happen overnight. Instead, by focusing on small changes, you can move through the stressors of the past year and develop long-term strategies to support yourself on an ongoing basis.


A great starting point for anyone who is ready to start prioritizing their mental health is to take a mental health screening at MHAscreening.org. It's a quick, free, and confidential way for someone to assess their mental health and begin finding hope and healing.

Ultimately, during this month of May, we want to remind everyone that mental illnesses are real, and recovery is possible. By developing your own #Tools2Thrive, it is possible to find balance between life's ups and downs and continue to cope with the challenges brought on by the pandemic.

This pandemic has affected the ways our congregation comes together to worship. From complete closure of our building and only online worship to our current protocols of mask wearing, hand sanitizer and social distancing. Although we are not able to return to our previous "normal forms of worship" such as singing and fellowship, let us remember that coming together as God's family to worship (following our ELCA liturgy) in our church building is still an important aspect of worship. Our council must follow the recommendations of the ELCA, the CDC and our local health care providers to promote the health and wellness of our congregation and community.

stained glass BUTTERFLY

Cut a piece of contact paper slightly larger than the butterfly. Peel the backing off and stick the stain glass black butterfly frame to the sticky side.

Place the small squares of tissue paper on the contact paper to cover the inside of the butterfly. Over lapping a little to cover completely.

Take the second piece of contact paper, peel off the backing, place it sticky side down on top of the tissue paper you just place on to the butterfly.

Trim off the excess contact paper around the butterfly.

Finally, snip a little hole into one of the butterfly wings, string the yarn through and tie a knot. Your stain glass butterfly is ready to hang in a window.

St. John's Lutheran Stewardship Committee News

As our committee met in March and April along with Pastor Mike we formulated short-term and long-term goals for St. John's Stewardship. We wish to share some of our work and activity plans for 2021.

One of our goals is the process of creating an "OPPORTUNITY LIST" for our members of St. John's. This list would be volunteers that match a specific need. Examples of needs are: drivers for member/s to healthcare appointments in town and out of town, handling the logistics of requests made by people regarding baptismal dates and other church related information they seek for ancestry research, grocery shopping for a home bound member or someone recovering from recent surgery, picking up medicine or mail, reading aloud a devotional or from the Bible for a brief time at the care center (once visits are safe again), as well as other specific needs that arise. Please inform Pastor Mike or the church secretary, Rabbecca Hennessey, of current or future areas for this "Opportunity List".

An IMMEDIATE NEED for our "Opportunity List" is in connection with our mobile food pantry held the third Monday of each month, rain or shine. The next date for the food pantry is Monday, May 17th. Here are the times when volunteers are needed:

- 3:00-4:00 - Volunteers who can do heavy lifting of food boxes from the basement to the outside. A cart and the elevator are available but it takes many hands.
- 4:00-6:00 - Volunteers to assist in loading the food outside into the vehicles. Items could be as light as a gallon of milk or three pounds of sausage to other heavier items. All volunteers are welcome and appreciated. Tasks are assigned for various jobs that each person can handle.

A second goal is to begin each month with a newsletter article to keep members informed and aware of the financials. These figures reflect the giving of March and April 2021 for the general fund to pay current expenses. The average monthly expenses is the amount based on the yearly budget approved by our congregational vote. The figures listed do not reflect any giving to the benevolence or improvement funds.

Another goal is the planning of special events in relation to stewardship and our members. We are working on small group ideas throughout the year as well a special Saturday/Sunday worship service for our congregation in November and a plan for Advent in December.

We, as the committee, are striving to meet regularly and assist in hoping, asking, and believing that God never does barely enough; God always does more.

Call to Order: President Brian Rodenberg called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Devotions and Prayers: Pastor Ashman read Acts 2:42-47. This is about the Apostles lives. Pastor asked us to think about how we experience Easter. Do we gobble it up, store it away, both, neither? The Apostles united in peace after the ascension. They shared with each other and those around them. Lutherans tend to be mute about faith. Successful churches have excited members willing to share their faith. Ultimately it is the savvy work of Jesus Christ, not the church. The questions were raised as to who has been invited to our church and who did the inviting? How are we going to be Easter people? We are called by Christ to be HIS witness.

Secretary's Report: The council reviewed the minutes of the last council meeting. The minutes of the March 11, 2021 meeting stand approved as published.

Treasurer's Report: Jim Solomon shared the Treasurer's report. One change was made to the Improvement Fund to correct a typo. The correct amount is listed below.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ashman submitted a written report for the previous month to keep the Council updated on his activities. He has begun to visit people in person. His report included the preparation for services, phone calls, newsletter articles, recording and sending weekly announcements and meditations via email, visiting residents at the Care Center via Skype, preparing and doing Lenten and Easter services, Bible Study preparation and class, recording children's sermon, Conducting First Communion classes and the First Communion services, and many other duties.

Outreach Ministries: Nancy Heitman reported that her committee had delivered Easter bags to the homebound, the Care Center, and to Assisted Living. They have Worship schedules ready to go to the local campgrounds and businesses.

The committee is still writing notes and sending monthly emails. The Outreach committee will be meeting with Pastor Mike on Tuesday.

Educational Ministries: Stephanie Thomas shared that her group hasn't met yet. Vacation Bible School this year will likely be a staycation event with a pick up and go format. Stephanie said that the Sunday School students enjoyed their parade with palms on Palm Sunday. On Easter there were fun Easter crafts for the younger students and a break out room for the older students. The last day of Sunday School will be May 23rd.

Children and Youth Ministries: Forest Brown and his committee are working to plan a youth trip.

Public Relations Ministries: Chuck Hemann had nothing new to report.

Stewardship Ministries: Sherry Oliver met with her committee on Mar. 25th. They plan to meet on the 4th Thurs. every month at 4:30 pm. The Stewardship committee set 4 tentative goals. They are looking at selecting a weekend to promote thanking the congregation with a tangible take away. They plan to actively get specific tasks & volunteers for the mobile food pantry, & plan to start a monthly blurb in the newsletter focusing on our budget, the expenses & the income. The congregation will be able to see the ups & downs of our treasury & become more aware of giving & expenses. Finally, they plan to create an opportunity list, finding the needs of our church & then finding matching volunteers. the goal is to get more people involved in the area of their strength. The committee also decided to keep the Adopt-A-Day at the current amount of \$38.

Worship & Music Ministries: Mary Streich had nothing new to report.

Property Ministries: Don Schmelzer will be meeting with his committee next week for a walk around to see what needs to be done & make plans for completion of those tasks. Among the council's suggestions were removing the nest on the back side of the parsonage & looking at the discoloration of the limestone on our church.

Parish Fellowship: Lorna Moser met with her committee and discussed their objectives. They identified past activities and brainstormed new activities. They will meet with Pastor Mike to discuss these. Lorna also shared an upcoming project where members of the congregation can pick up a kit to make two stained glass butterflies, one for home and one to bring back to church to promote fellowship. We discussed having cupcakes for graduation on May 30th.

Vice President: Michele VonHandorf had nothing new to report.

Old Business:

Church Secretary Start Date and Training Plans Brian informed the council that Rabecca Hennessey will start training on Monday, April 12th. The goal is for her training to be complete by the end of April.

Parsonage Carpet Update: The carpet has been installed for a cost of \$1,296.00.

Elevator Update: The sensor on the elevator was replaced & is working appropriately. The cost was \$2,612.00.

New Business:

Parsonage Oven Repair: The oven in the parsonage was heating between 30 and 35 degrees above the set temperature. Kuempels has repaired it.

Church Pictorial Directory: It has been about 10 years since the last directory. Lifetouch no longer does churches. We would need to look at other companies. There would be no cost to the church. The company would sell photographs to families. We are looking at this for the future when it can be done safely. Michele will check with the school photographers to see if they do churches.

Seating Restrictions Moving Forward: Brian researched the seating protocols of other area churches. We are pretty much in line with what others are doing. What we're doing meets the needs of those coming to church. We also discussed singing at church. It was shared that the high school is performing with students wearing masks. We noted the need for a plan, and it was noted that some members are coming back because of the safety of the current restrictions. A suggestion was made that we begin by singing the sending song. People uncomfortable with singing could leave prior to that last song. It was decided to have the Worship and Music Committee discuss bringing music back into our services.

Summer Worship Schedule: The summer worship schedule of church starting at 9:15 am begins on May 30th.

Community Foundation Investment: The council was asked to think of how we want to use the Community Foundation Investment payout from the Matthew 28 & Donor Account. Bring your ideas to the next council meeting.

Head Usher Duties: The Head Usher has been asked to add turning on the power strip to the new recording system in the balcony so that it will be warmed up and ready for church services.

Thank You Diane!: The council took time to thank Diane Schilling for her years of service as church Secretary and Ministry Coordinator. We have been blessed with her dedication.

Adjournment: Meeting adjourned at 8:04 pm.

St. John's Generation to Generation Cookbook - 1997

Crumb Topping:

- 1 c flour 3/4 c oatmeal
- 1 c firmly packed brown sugar 1 tsp cinnamon
- 4 c diced rhubarb 2 T cornstarch
- 1 c sugar 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 c water

Mix topping together and press half of crumbs in greased 9-inch pan. Cover with rhubarb. Combine sugar, water, cornstarch and vanilla and cook until clear. Pour over rhubarb and top with remaining crumbs.

Bake 1 hour at 350 degrees. Serve warm with whipped cream.
