Dear Friends,

The past couple of days have been quiet -- classes and Bible studies are complete for the Summer. Pictures for the directory have been taken (still quite a bit of work to be done, though). I have taken some time to catch up on sleep—but also to dream and scheme about how we may continue to grow both in faithfulness and witness.

The first thing is that my door is open—if you wish to visit—or if you need something more. You can have a tour of the parsonage—just to warn you—we have a “lived in” look to the place—do not expect perfection. Stop in for a piece of pie and some coffee—just let me know in advance.

Also, I will try my best to do some more home visits this summer— time permitting. I would love to hear your stories—and just visit. Please do not be shy—just give me a call.

Here are a few more ideas that have been floating around. Some have been suggested by others. We could form a men's breakfast and Bible Study that could meet once a month at a local establishment. I have done these before—with the main focus being fellowship in Jesus' name. This would take place during the late fall into winter months when people are no longer in the fields.

We could form a church walking/exercise group—nothing too strenuous. God has called us into stewardship of our body—to take care of the gift of ourselves. During the winter months, we could do something inside. Non-members would be more than welcome.

We could hold a Lutheran College Recruitment afternoon for sophomores and juniors. We could invite our local ELCA colleges to visit. This also would be an open event for all community students. I would also invite some of Synod partners to visit with us about the TEEM program as a way for people to investigate a possible call to work in the church.

We should never limit ourselves to the past—but look how our ministry can continue to expand and grow—a vision that includes people of all ages and talents. We have the opportunity to dream about how we can continue to witness through our faith in so many new and exciting ways for our congregation and also our community.

So let us live into the prophet Joel's vision as Pentecost people:

I will pour out my Spirit on all people.
Your sons and daughters will prophesy,
your old men will dream dreams,
your young men will see visions.
Even on my servants, both men and women,
I will pour out my Spirit in those days. (Joel 2)





Last week my husband and I went to Syttende Mai, Norway's independence celebration in Westby WI. It was full of great food (varme polsa, lefse, meatballs and gravy, and smooth grommegrot - NO lutefisk for me) beautiful rosemaling and woodcarving, festive garments, fetching music, and people out enjoying a beautiful day of fellowship.

I could not help but think of Jesus walking through the hills of Galilee with peoples coming out to see and hear what this teacher had to say. Think about being one of the 5,000 or 4,000 that were fed and listening to the young man teaching who was the Son of God, knew God's heart intimately, and was returning to His Father shortly leaving His Spirit to lead, guide, and comfort us at every turn. Call to Order: Vice President Michele VonHandorf called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Devotions & Prayers: Pastor Ashman led the devotion from the book of Revelations.

Secretary's Report: The council reviewed minutes of the April 7th, 2022 council meeting. No additions or corrections were noted. Vice President VonHandorf declared the minutes as approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ashman submitted a written report for April 2022 to keep the council updated on his activities. April was an extremely busy month with Easter, First Communion and Confirmation activities. Pastor also shared summer vacation dates and that he only has two sessions left of his Stephen Ministry training.

Outreach Ministries: Diane reported that the group has met and that the meeting went well. Sing along continue to go well. Members delivered Easter bags.

Educational Ministries: Stephanie reported that they had Muffins with Mom on May 8th. Registration for VBS, June 13-17th is complete with 94 youth registered. Volunteers are still needed. The last day of Sunday School is May 22nd. Awards, games, and events are planned.

Children & Youth Ministries: Forest was absent, but Pastor reported that they are working on the service event for youth the last week of July.

Public Relations: Chuck will be making the announcement of the transition to summer hours

Stewardship Ministries: Sherry was absent but had reported to other members that they would not be meeting in May. Congregation members are completing the Time and Talent surveys while waiting for their pictures to be taken for the directory. Those will be tabulated in June.

Worship & Music Ministries: Mary reported that Pastor will be gone for services on August 7th and 14th. The congregation is encouraged to continue to request hymns. The group is also planning for the Senior Recognition on May 29th, Christmas in July service, and that Music in the Park will be August 28th.

Property Ministries: Frank reported that the group met and did a walk around of the church as well as a walkthrough of the parsonage.

Parish Fellowship: Lorna Moser was absent however she did provide a written report. The Mother, Daughter, Friend Tea was a huge success with 60 people in attendance with 12 volunteers. May fellowship after services is arranged and they are currently working on June. They will also be organizing fellowship for after the Saturday evening service. A donation board will be set up in the narthex for items needed for VBS. We also discussed having "thank you" flyers made for businesses to post when donating items for VBS.

V.P. Report: No report given.

Old Business: Property Ministries did an assessment of repairs to the parking lot and the leaking area within the narthex. Improvements were recommended to the parsonage. Michele contacted Dave Poggenklass to wash the parsonage windows.

New Business:

Frank provided further details of improvements needed to the parsonage. Several minor repairs were noted along with installing screen doors on the home and office. Mary motioned and Chuck seconded the motion to move forward with the repairs recommended by the Property committee. In addition, the Property Committee recommended a remodel of the 2nd floor parsonage bathroom. Craig made a motion to move forward with this project. Diane seconded the motion.

In other new business, the Council reviewed and discussed the Epic/Benevolence Fund. Chuck motioned and Mary seconded the motion to provide two \$750.00 scholarships to students of our congregation attending Wartburg.


