

One of the biggest life lessons I learned from...



Call to Order: President Brian Rodenberg called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Devotions & Prayers: Pastor Ashman led with an opening devotion from the Book of John and a prayer.

Secretary's Report: The council reviewed minutes of the April council meeting. No additions or corrections were noted. The minutes were approved as published.

Treasurer's Report: Chuck made a motion to approve the report as published. Michele seconded the motion.

General Fund: \$22,697.07 Benevolence: \$26,264.67 Improvement: \$51,620.53 Memorial Fund: \$82,868.16 Benevolence Savings: \$15,774.13 Sunday School: \$ 1,117.25 Organ Fund: \$ 3,365.22 Scrip: \$ 4,070.94 Luther League: \$ 5,673.59 **Ending Balance:** \$213,451.56

Pastor's Report: A written report was presented by Pastor Ashman highlighting last month's activities. Pastor reminded the Council that he will be attending a Synod meeting on June 9th. We continue to look for a volunteer to lead the Saturday evening worship. He also reported that there are several baptisms scheduled.

Outreach Ministries: Diane and Myron Thiese and Trudy and Gerald Glawe will be attending the Synod meeting on June 9 & 10th.

Educational Ministries: Penny continues to focus on VBS which will be held June 12th-16th. Ninety-nine students are currently registered. She continues to look for volunteers. Set up will be held on June 11th.

Children & Youth Ministries: Forest reported that they continue to seek input regarding mission trip options for this summer. A survey was sent to eligible youth.

Public Relations: No report

Stewardship Ministries: Sherry reported that the thermometer is up and showing the progress of the donations toward the basement renovation project. The group has also been discussing future temple talks.

Worship & Music Ministries: No report

Property Ministries: Frank discussed electrical issues to be addressed which include lighting in the "Rose" window.

Parish Fellowship: Lorna provided a report. She is working with Penny on VBS. A Kitchen crew has been organized. Following completion of the kitchen remodel, volunteers will be needed for set up of the kitchen to prepare for VBS. Volunteers are needed for openings during the Farmer's Market for coffee sales.

V.P. Report: No report.

Old Business:

Remodel update – Brian reported that the new flooring will be installed next week. The storage units will be installed following the flooring installation. Final finishing work will be completed after that.

Remodeling donations/pledge update – Craig provided a donation and pledge update relative to the remodeling project.

New Business:

Transfer of funds from the Memorial Savings to the Improvement Fund in the amount of \$70,000 to pay outstanding bills for the remodeling project. A motion was made by Chuck and a second motion by Mary to approve this transfer. Motion carried.

A gift of \$7500 was received from the Green Bay Church where Pastor Mike had once served. A motion was made by Michele and a second motion by Forest to use this gift for the remodeling project. Motion carried.

Parsonage window cleaning was discussed. Michele will contact Dave Poggenklas whom has done it in previous years.

Replacement of some landscaping around parsonage. Frank will follow up with this.

Bulbs within the narthex lights that need replacing. Frank will follow up with this as well.

A Dedication Ceremony for the renovated basement space/ fellowship hall is being planned for June 25th. Lorna, Michele, Deb, and Penny have volunteered for the planning committee.

Adjournment: A motion was made to adjourn. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer at 7:59 pm.
