



BIBLE 101



Please let Pastor know if you are interested in this type of study.





One of the biggest life lessons I learned from...

two accidents that left me with severe injuries. Having to overcome a shattered left hip, broken pelvic bone, and a concussion meant spending seven months with crutches, then a year with a cane. During this time of slow healing I had many occasions to reflect on my life. I realized after my second accident that I needed to re-assess and take a step back to see the big picture. These accidents reminded me to do good, be better, and certainly my faith got me through it all. Two months after the accident I was able to finally enter the church and go up for communion. The emotion I felt at being in the sanctuary again and in the presence of God was overwhelming.

To me, grace means...

the fulfillment of understanding all the early Christian teachings while building the foundation for my adult life. I believe Jesus Christ was sent to save us from our sins. This is the biggest gift we have! The ultimate grace is forgiveness.

I'm a Lutheran because...

my parents raised me as a Lutheran and I feel comfortable and proud to say I am a Christian. When I attend worship, listen to our pastor or meet other people they serve as good reminders of lessons from the Bible. I recall being asked to speak during the Lenten season on the Prodigal Son text. As I reflected and contemplated which am I?, perhaps both, this experience pushed me out of my comfort zone but also grew my faith. I have a deep commitment and need to attend church to receive God's grace and be filled with the Holy Spirit. My wife, Tina, and I are purposely building a faith foundation for our family. We see the importance of attending worship and being involved at St. John's. I am serving as chair of the Children & Youth Ministry of the St. John's Lutheran Church Council. I thank you for this opportunity and the trust you've given me during my term, which ends January of 2024.

Saying goodbye to summer and transitioning into a new school year can be a difficult time for many adolescents, especially those with emotional or behavioral disorders.

LSI has 27 therapists that provide mental health counseling to individuals of all ages through inperson therapy in over 20 locations across the state and virtual therapy in all 99 counties. In 2022, our Clinical Services team served more than 1,000 clients, totaling 14,000+ therapy sessions for lowans of all ages.

In addition, our Behavioral Health Intervention Services team wraps care around a child's entire family to empower them with skills like anger management, healthy decision-making and problem-solving. In 2022, the BHIS team served over 250 clients, resulting in more than 3,900 therapy sessions for children and their families.
