On Valentine's Day, we have the celebration of the love that two people find in each other (I have not been that lucky, I suppose). They have a special date night, offer gifts that include candy—and profess their love for each other. But there comes the truth behind it all—that on Ash Wednesday, we are reminded that it is God who created us—and for what purpose?? You guessed it. Love. God created us out of love and for love. Behind the love that we feel for one another is the love that God has first had for us.

This year once again we will feature people that were around the cross of Jesus—and listen to their stories. Some are touching—others are painful—every single one of them are riveting as they relate their story.

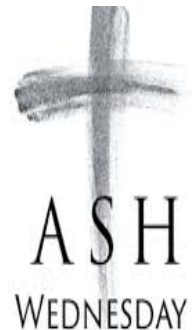

Highlights from 2023

The theme for Stewardship 2023 was “The Faithfulness of God”. It was expressed by the following actions.

Beginning in February, the Stewardship Committee worked closely with the church council to write letters for the capital campaign addressing the Fellowship Basement Remodel Project. Letters were mailed out, a thermometer recorded the giving and pledges received, and updates were shared throughout the process. If you have not had a chance to see the new fellowship area, please take a look. The new space creates so many opportunities for St. John's to share the Good News with others.

In October Stewardship ran a winter gear clothing drive for the local Family Resource Center. Coats, especially children sizes, were collected along with hats, mittens, snow pants, and scarves.

In November Stewardship had their annual “Thank You” weekend for the congregation. A video of 2023 church happenings was created and shared by Erin Bries at both worship services. Special readings and hymns were sung to enhance our theme. Pastor Mike Ashman's sermon keyed in on specific examples from the Bible of God's faithfulness to His people then and now. Fellowship was held after both worship services and St. John's Lutheran pens and totes were given to members.

In December Stewardship gave Advent calendars out to members. This calendar seeks to give one suggested food item each day during the Advent season. On January 3, 2024 the collected food will be sorted and then delivered to the local Family Resource Center. This is to replenish their supplies after the holidays.

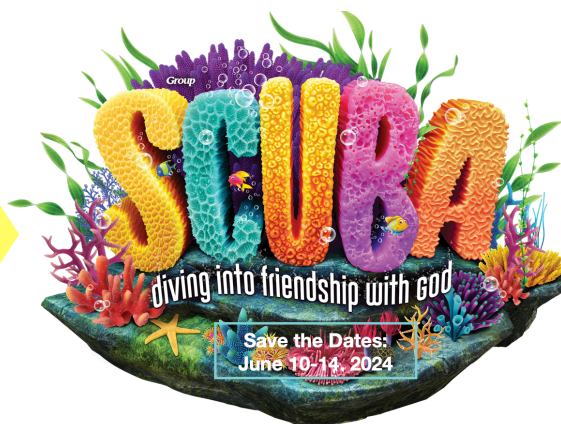
