

The Baptism of Our Lord

January 9-10, 2021



The Baptism of Our Lord is always celebrated on the first Sunday of the Epiphany season, the season of revealing. We have just seen Jesus, born of Mary in Bethlehem at Christmas, revealed by a star to the Wise Men as the one born “King of the Jews.” Now Mark, uniquely among the Synoptics, begins his revealing with the Baptism of Jesus at the beginning of his book (Mk 1:9–11, this Sunday’s Gospel). This reveals that Jesus is the Savior, who now begins His ministry of preaching the good news about the kingdom of God, healing the sick, and casting out demons, all culminating in His suffering, death, and resurrection for the salvation of all who believe and are baptized (Mk 16:16). At Jesus’ Baptism, the Father’s voice reveals, “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased” (Mk 1:11). The Epiphany season culminates with the Transfiguration of Our Lord, when the Father speaks again: “This is my beloved Son; listen to him” (Mk 9:7). The Old Testament Reading reveals the amazing news that in the beginning, God created the world out of nothing by the power of His Word alone. We are familiar with how the opening verse of John parallels the opening verses of Genesis: “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God” (Jn 1:1). We also note, though, the parallel with Gen 1:1 in the first verse of Mark’s Gospel: “The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God” (Mk 1:1). The world that God made had fallen into sin and rebellion, and now God’s promise to restore all things is coming to fruition with the appearing of John the Baptizer and the revealing of Jesus, God’s Son, in His Baptism. This is very good news indeed! The first words of Jesus that Mark records are “The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God’s at hand; repent and believe in the gospel” (Mk 1:15).

Each day confess your "sin-fulness" before God and ask Him for His forgiveness and the Holy Spirit to use you and yours to His glory.

P: Heavenly Father,

C: we confess that we are by nature sinful and have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed. On account of Jesus, forgive us, renew us, and unite us to Your name.

ABSOLUTION

Think of ways you can each day this week creatively show forth (Epiphany) your sense of rejoicing that your "sin-fulness" has been cleansed.

P: Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die and rise for you. In Baptism, you were united to Christ in both His death and resurrection. You were buried with Him, but also raised to walk in newness of life. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen. We are dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

From the beginning, Creator God and the Holy Spirit were together as one giving form to a formless earth and speaking light to the darkness.

¹In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. ²The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. ³And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE READING: Romans 6:1-11

We have freedom in Christ, but this does not give us the excuse to sin.

We as Christians have died with Christ and have been raised up with Him into new life.

¹What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. ⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

People: Thanks be to God.

HOLY GOSPEL: Mark 1:4-11

John's baptism was one of repentance and forgiveness. But when John baptized Jesus in the Jordan River, the heavens tore open and he saw the Spirit descending on Jesus like a dove. He heard the voice of God confirming the Sonship of Jesus. In that holy moment, all three persons of the Godhead were witnessed by John.

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the first chapter.

People: Glory to You, O Lord.

⁴John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." ⁹In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens opening and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

Pastor: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ.

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NOTES AND NEWS

Church Sanctuary Worship Service Guidelines

Special guidelines will be followed to help assure the safety of everyone attending church, but we know the coronavirus is still active among us. We know that God desires us all to be together in worship again, but we are also sure He wants us to use good judgement in protecting our health.

- We encourage elderly, at-risk, and symptomatic people to continue worshipping from home (the “live streaming” service on Face Book continues).
“At risk” conditions include: 65 years or older, chronic lung disease, moderate/severe asthma, serious heart conditions, compromised immune systems, severe obesity, diabetes, chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis and liver disease.
- **Wearing face masks inside the church/sanctuary is REQUIRED.** If you don’t have one, masks are available throughout the church, along with hand sanitizing stations. Pastor will wear a mask, except when preaching God’s Word.
- Services will be held at 6:00 pm on Saturdays, and 9:00 am & 11:00 am on Sundays. Doors will open 30 minutes prior to each service and secured during the services.
- To comply with 6’ social distancing guidelines, seating will be limited to every third pew (2 pews in between). Family groups and individuals will be separated by 6’ in each pew. Services will be limited to approximately 75 attendees. Overflow will be asked to listen to the service on FM 92.1 in their cars.
- Ushers and Elders will assist with entry and dismissal to maintain social distancing. Do not sit in the taped off pews and follow the Ushers/Elders directions. We will be seating front to back upon entry and dismissing from back to front.
- Ushers (wearing gloves & masks) will hand out bulletins with the service liturgy and hymns (please take these home; they can’t be reused). Hymnals, Bibles and attendance books have been removed from the pews.
- Offerings are collected at the sanctuary doorways while exiting the service. Exit the church promptly upon dismissal as the sanctuary, hallways, restrooms **MUST** be sanitized before the next service. Please socialize outside the church.

These guidelines are based on current Federal, State and County Health requirements and the recommendations of the LCMS to provide for your well-being. Although, we are taking steps to reduce the spread of Covid-19 or other infectious agents, the ultimate responsibility for preventative measures belongs to whomever comes to join us at St. Johns’. Thank you for your patience and understanding during these challenging time.

If you wish not to receive the Sacrament, you may exit out the front doors or wait in line and exit from the Marie Pfarr Room. Please follow social distancing and hand sanitizer is available. **If you choose to attend worship from the parking lot instead of the sanctuary,** as soon as the church has emptied, you will be invited to come in and receive communion at that time, or to avoid leaving your vehicle you can drive under the portico (Marie Pfarr Room side), stop and roll down your window to receive communion.




