We are now at the Sunday immediately before the ascension, an appropriate time to look back in awe and appreciation of everything that has preceded it—not just during this Easter season, but throughout the entire festival half of the Church Year. Compared to other major rivers of the world (the Mississippi, the Amazon), the river Jordan isn't much of a river. It is neither long nor wide nor overly deep. It is distinctive among rivers because it is the lowest and because it flows into the Dead Sea, the lowest body of water on this planet. Down to this lowest of rivers from the insignificant town of Nazareth, Jesus comes to be baptized. Not atop Mount Zion in Jerusalem at the Gihon Spring (1 Kings 1), where Solomon, son of David, had been anointed a thousand years before, but at this lowly river, Jesus is anointed in Baptism with the Holy Spirit and with power. Our text, the First Reading for Easter 6, demonstrates the urgency of the first-century believers (the apostle Peter, in this case) in proclaiming the crucified and resurrected Christ to all, for repentance and the forgiveness of sins. The Psalm is a joyful testimony that God's salvation is for "all the earth" (Ps 98:4). The Gospel reminds us that we did not choose Jesus; he chose us. When we "abide" in Jesus, the Vine, we bear fruit, which is identified in John and also in the Epistle from 1 John as agapē, a love that selflessly serves others.

## **Seeing as God Sees, Loving as God Loves** Acts 10:34–40

No one is out of the reach of God's love. Yes, God our Savior "desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Tim 2:4). Aren't you glad that's true for you? That you are included among those God desires to save? Aren't you glad that it's true for everyone else? (And I mean everyone!) Are you glad? Do you see all people as God sees them? Do you love them all as God loves them? Does our congregation? Is our congregation a place of grace in a cold and lonely world, a place where we are eager to connect all people to God's love for them in Jesus Christ? All people? Today we hear about God's grace in a unique way in Acts 10, where Peter proclaims, "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him"

We have not always been ready to care and quick to help. We do indeed deserve Your punishment in this life and for eternity. Trusting in Your mercy, we come to You for forgiveness. Grant us forgiveness of all our sins, and by the power of the Holy Spirit at work within our hearts and lives, lead us into ways that reflect Your goodness and love.

## First Reading *Acts 10:34–48*

*Always read the Old Testament with Jesus and His ministry and mission as the key to understanding any Old Testament passage.*

*In those early days after Jesus' ascension, the Holy Spirit worked powerfully to move both Jews and Gentiles to the Lord, thus proving that He doesn't show favoritism, but loves all people. Peter and other followers were astonished at the Holy Spirit's pouring out and baptized those who had received in the name of Jesus.*

<sup>34</sup>Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, <sup>35</sup>but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. <sup>36</sup>As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), <sup>37</sup>you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: <sup>38</sup>how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. <sup>39</sup>And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, <sup>40</sup>but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, <sup>41</sup>not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. <sup>42</sup>And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. <sup>43</sup>To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name." <sup>44</sup>While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. <sup>45</sup>And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles. <sup>46</sup>For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared, <sup>47</sup>"Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" <sup>48</sup>And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to remain for some days.

**L** This is the Word of the Lord. **C** Thanks be to God.

## Epistle *1 John 5:1–8*

*The Epistles are great for personal weekday devotional reading and study – pick a letter this week and read it, think on it and share it with a friend, family member or someone with whom you work or play.*

*We know we are children of God when we believe that Jesus is the Christ. We also prove that we are children of God by loving Him and carrying out His commands. By doing so, we have victory over the world in Christ Jesus!*

<sup>1</sup>Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the Father loves whoever has been born of him. <sup>2</sup>By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. <sup>3</sup>For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome. <sup>4</sup>For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith. <sup>5</sup>Who is it that overcomes the world except the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? <sup>6</sup>This is he who came by water and blood—Jesus Christ; not by the water only but by the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. <sup>7</sup>For there are three that testify: <sup>8</sup>the Spirit and the water and the blood; and these three agree.

**Gradual** *adapt. from Matthew 28:7; Hebrews 2:7; Psalm 8:6*

When we sacrifice what means most to us and choose to love Father God and one another, we experience the complete joy of Jesus and the working of the One and Only Holy Spirit who produces fruit for us to bear.*

**C** **Glory to You, O Lord.**

<sup>9</sup>[Jesus said:] "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. <sup>10</sup>If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. <sup>11</sup>These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full. <sup>12</sup>"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup>Greater love has no one than this, that someone lays down his life for his friends. <sup>14</sup>You are my friends if you do what I command you. <sup>15</sup>No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. <sup>16</sup>You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. <sup>17</sup>These things I command you, so that you will love one another."

**Confirmation 2020-21 Information:** Confirmation for both the 2020 & 2021 classes will take place on Pentecost Sunday May 23<sup>rd</sup>. The 2020 class will observe the Rite of Confirmation at the 9 a.m. service and the 2021 class at the 11 a.m. service. Plans are to have communion at these services to allow the confirmands to celebrate their First Communion.

The Board of Elders is asking for everyone's cooperation on a situation concerning the 9 a.m. service with the 2020 class. This is the largest of the 2 classes and with family members and anticipated numbers of invited guests, the sanctuary will be completely full. We are asking, if at all possible, if you are not an invited guest of family members of a confirmand that you consider attending the Saturday Evening Service at 6 p.m. May 22<sup>nd</sup> which has ample room. The 11 a.m. service has a smaller class with fewer invited guests so there might be a little extra room there. If you want to attend either service and are not guests or family members of the confirmands, the cafeteria will be open for both services and view the live streaming of the services on the large flat screen TV. We realize this is an inconvenience but we are asking for your understanding.

**REVISED: Church Sanctuary Worship Service Guidelines**

Special guidelines will be followed to help assure the safety of everyone attending church, but we know the coronavirus is still active among us. We know that God desires us all to be together in worship again, but we are also sure He wants us to use good judgement in protecting our health.

Many members who were considered “at-risk” and felt uncomfortable sitting inside the church have now been vaccinated. If you now feel comfortable coming back inside, please do so. We still ask that you wear a mask and practice social distancing. The pews are sanitized after each service and hand sanitizer is available throughout the church. **However, if you have a symptomatic health condition, please check with your doctor to see if it is advisable to return at this time.**

**Wearing face masks inside the church/sanctuary is REQUIRED.** If you don’t have one, masks are available at the door, along with hand sanitizing stations. Pastor will wear a mask, except when preaching God’s Word.

To comply with 6’ social distancing guidelines, seating will be limited to every other pew. Family groups and individuals will be separated by 6’ in each pew. Services will be limited to approximately 180 attendees. Overflow will be asked to listen to the service on FM 92.1 in their cars.

Ushers and Elders will assist with entry and dismissal to maintain social distancing. Do not sit in the taped off pews and follow the Ushers/Elders directions. We will be seating front to back upon entry and dismissing from back to front.

Ushers (wearing gloves & masks) will hand out bulletins with the service liturgy and hymns (please take these home; they can’t be reused). Hymnals, Bibles and attendance books have been removed from the pews.

Offerings are collected at the sanctuary doorways while exiting the service.

These guidelines are based on current Federal, State and County Health requirements and the recommendations of the LCMS to provide for your well-being. Although, we are taking steps to reduce the spread of Covid-19 or other infectious agents, the ultimate responsibility for preventative measures belongs to whomever comes to join us at St. Johns’. Thank you for your patience and understanding during these challenging time.

**Church Window Restoration:** The Board of Properties would like to thank all who contributed to the Church Roof and Steeple Project (Save Our Steeple)! Thanks to the kind donations and the efficient work of our contractors, there is a substantial amount of money left to roll forward into the next large upkeep and maintenance project; our stained glass windows. These windows were made in Germany and are original to the church in the year 1900. Now is the time that we need to invest in these sentimental and historically important parts of our church. The work will include the removal, historic restoration and reinstallation of the window behind the organ. Fix bulges, install new steel supports and re-cement the large window on the North side, and cover the front windows with storm windows. The estimate for this work is \$117,000.
