

Fifth Sunday after Pentecost

June 26-27, 2021



On the Fifth Sunday after Pentecost, the Church finds itself marching sequentially through much of the Gospel of Mark. On this day, the Gospel from Mark 5 records two miracles of Jesus that are intercut together. Jesus is on His way to heal Jairus's daughter when He is interrupted by a woman who had suffered from a bleeding disorder for twelve years. Though Jairus's daughter is near death—and this is a time-sensitive healing—Jesus stops to heal the woman, speak with her, bless her. During this interruption, Jairus's daughter dies. Yet, not even death can stop Jesus. He raises this twelve-year-old girl from the dead. These two miracles of Jesus set the tone for this Sunday. The Introit uses select verses from Psalm 121. The antiphon from verses 1 and 2 fits these healings so well: "I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth." The Old Testament Reading from Lamentations 3 also contains several lines that connect well to the Gospel. For example, verse 25 (which also happens to be today's Verse): "The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him." The Psalm also connects to Mark 5, particularly, "You have turned for me my mourning into dancing; you have loosed my sackcloth and clothed me with gladness" (Ps 30:11). As is often the case during the Pentecost season, the Epistle does not pick up the theme of the day as strongly as the other readings. Yet one can see the interplay of God's grace shining through suffering. The faith of the severely afflicted Macedonian churches (2 Cor 8:2) is praised much as the healed woman is. Above all, Jesus' generosity is visible in every healing He performs. June 27 is the commemoration of Cyril of Alexandria. Just preceding have been the Feast of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (Thursday, June 24) and the anniversary of the presentation of the Augsburg Confession (Friday, June 25).

“Wait Quietly - Great Is God's Faithfulness” - Lamentations 3:22-33

Our text is in the center of a highly poetic book, a lament over the destruction of God's temple and city, and the consequent dismemberment of God's corporate people into scattered exiles. Against this background comes a beautiful reaffirmation of living trust in God, who is able to raise the dead, and who extends hope in the midst of the direst circumstances. This is a theme close to the heart of every hearer. How often are we speechless in the face of overwhelming catastrophe. Disasters occur in all our lives, and in the face of death we can only hope in the life of the world to come. We would not know what to say, what Christian witness to offer, were it not for the assurance that “The Lord is my portion.”

EPISTLE READING: *2 Corinthians 8:1-9, 13-15*

The Macedonian churches faced severe trials including poverty.

Their response was overflowing joy and rich generosity in the midst of their suffering.

¹We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, ²for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. ³For they gave

according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own free will,
4begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints— 5and this, not as
we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us.
6Accordingly, we urged Titus that as he had started, so he should complete among you this

HOLY GOSPEL: Mark 5:21-43

Just a touch of Jesus' cloak was all it took, and a woman who suffered from chronic bleeding was healed. The crowds pushed against Him, desperate to receive from and experience the Christ, but Jesus asked, "Who touched me?" Her touch was full of persevering faith, and it was her faith that shuffled through the crowds and healed her at last. When asked to heal Jairus' daughter who was pronounced dead, Jesus turned to the devastated father and said, "Don't be afraid; just believe." The little girl arose in response to Jesus' voice, and a miracle once again took place because of faith.

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the fifth chapter.

21When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered about him, and he was beside the sea. 22Then came one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name, and seeing him, he fell at his feet 23and implored him earnestly, saying, “My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well and live.” 24And he went with him. And a great crowd followed him and thronged about him. 25And there was a woman who had had a discharge of blood for twelve years, 26and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. 27She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. 28For she said, “If I touch even his garments, I will be made well.” 29And immediately the flow of blood dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. 30And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone out from him, immediately turned about in the crowd and said, “Who touched my garments?” 31And his disciples said to him, “You see the crowd pressing around you, and yet you say, ‘Who touched me?’” 32And he looked around to see who had done it. 33But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before him and told him the whole truth. 34And he said to her, “Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease.” 35While he was still speaking, there came from the ruler’s house some who said, “Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the Teacher any further?” 36But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the ruler of the synagogue, “Do not fear, only believe.” 37And he allowed no one to follow him except

Peter and James and John the brother of James. ³⁸They came to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, and Jesus saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. ³⁹And when he had entered, he said to them, "Why are you making a commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but sleeping." ⁴⁰And they laughed at him. But he put them all outside and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him and went in where the child was. ⁴¹Taking her by the hand he said to her, "Talitha cumi," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise." ⁴²And immediately the girl got up and began walking (for she was twelve years of age), and they were immediately overcome with amazement. ⁴³And he strictly charged them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.



Revised Church Sanctuary Worship Service Guidelines

The Board of Elders has approved the following guidelines to reopen the sanctuary in response to the governor's announcement:

- **Mask wearing will be optional and will no longer be required**, but will still be available for those choosing to use them.
- Gloves will no longer be required for the ushers.
- The pew tape will be removed, and every pew will be available for seating.
- The Plexiglass shields will no longer be used.
- Communion will return to normal, with the exception that the Common Cup will not be used at this time, and everyone will be asked to return to their pew until the service is concluded.
- Those wishing to receive communion in their cars may continue to do so.
- Hymnals, Bibles and Attendance Cards will be placed back into the pews at a later date.
- Contemporary Service will return at a later date.
- The Offering Boxes will still be used until further notice.
- Hand sanitizer will still be available.


