Church Sanctuary Worship Service Guidelines

The Board of Elders has approved the following guidelines to reopen the sanctuary in response to the governor's announcement:

- **Mask wearing will be optional and will no longer be required**, but will still be available for those choosing to use them.
- Gloves will no longer be required for the ushers.
- Every pew will be available for seating.
- The Plexiglass shields will no longer be used.
- Communion will return to normal, with the exception that the Common Cup will not be used at this time, and everyone will be asked to return to their pew until the service is concluded.
- Those wishing to receive communion in their cars may continue to do so.
- Attendance Cards will be placed back into the pews at a later date.
- Contemporary Service will return at a later date.
- The Offering Boxes will still be used until further notice.
- Hand sanitizer will still be available.

EAGLES MEET AT ST. PAUL, CHUCKERY

Approximately 40 Golden Eagles gathered September 20th at St. Paul, Chuckery to tour their newly completed meeting space, enjoy lunch together, and to meet "Mercy", the new Marysville Police Department therapy dog! Mercy's handler, Officer Amy Findley, a 20 year veteran of the force, is assigned as a School Resource Officer at Marysville Early College High School, where she and Mercy patrol the halls daily, interacting with students. Officer Findlay reports that students respond positively to the canine officer-in-training, and she serves as a calming influence during times of stress or anxiety.

Because Mercy is still quite young, only six months, she is in the early part of her training learning basic commands. Like many young pups, she can easily be distracted, but as Officer Findley demonstrated, readily responds to the small bag of treats that Officer Findlay keeps handy on her equipment belt! Officer Findley stressed that Mercy will not be trained to work in crime situations, but rather to serve as a comfort dog when needed to calm students who are experiencing stress. Our thanks go out to Officer Findley for taking the time to allow us to meet Mercy, and to the members of St. Paul, Chuckery for sharing their facilities with us.


