


# Twenty-Fifth Sunday after Pentecost

November 13-14, 2021



On this second-last Sunday of the Church Year, the readings point to “the end” (Mk 13:7, 13, Gospel), “the Day drawing near” (Heb 10:25, Epistle; see also the Hymn of the Day, LSB 508), “the day of our Lord Jesus Christ” (Collect). The readings account for the destruction to be seen on that day, but also the day’s deliverance and the Church’s enduring confidence as that day draws near. Regarding destruction, “there shall be a time of trouble” (Dan 12:1, Old Testament Reading). As the temple was destroyed in AD 70 (Mk 13:2), so destructive “birth pangs” will precede the end (cf Mk 13:8). Regarding deliverance, thanks be to God that the Church is not the temple destined for destruction but, rather, the people who “shall be delivered” (Dan 12:1), “the saints,” “the excellent ones” in whom the Lord delights, who will not “see corruption” (Ps 16:3, 10, Psalm). Through Baptism into Christ, their names have been “written in the book” (Dan 12:1). The Church is the people who continue to pray, “Release us from the bonds of our sins” (Collect), and, by the blood of Jesus, walk “the path of life” (Ps 16:11). In fact, the Church enters even now into the presence of God through “the new and living way” Christ has opened by His flesh and blood, received by the congregation in the Lord’s Supper (Heb 10:20). On the Last Day, the Church will be “the ones coming out of the great tribulation” who “have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb” (Rev 7:14, Gradual). They “will be saved” (Mk 13:13) out of the destruction of the old creation and delivered into the new creation by the blood of Jesus. Regarding confidence, then, the sacrifice of Christ, as well as His presence and activity within His Church today, gives the Church the “confidence” to enter now “by the blood of Jesus” (Heb 10:19) and to “stand firm” forever (Collect). Since Christ is present with the Church in Word and Sacrament, believers “shall not be shaken” (Ps 16:8). It is in Him, with Him, and through Him, with His whole Church, that they are able to endure to the end and be saved (Mk 13:13).

<sup>1</sup>Every priest stands daily at his service, offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. <sup>2</sup>But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, <sup>3</sup>waiting from that time until his enemies should be made a footstool for his feet. <sup>4</sup>For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those

who are being sanctified. <sup>15</sup>And the Holy Spirit also bears witness to us; for after saying, <sup>16</sup>“This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, declares the Lord: I will put my laws on their hearts, and write them on their minds,” <sup>17</sup>then he adds, “I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more.” <sup>18</sup>Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin. <sup>19</sup>Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, <sup>20</sup>by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, <sup>21</sup>and since we have a great priest over the house of God, <sup>22</sup>let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. <sup>23</sup>Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. <sup>24</sup>And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, <sup>25</sup>not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

**HOLY GOSPEL:** *Mark 13:1-13*

***As a disciple was admiring the architectural stones of buildings, Jesus used this as a teaching moment to explain the destructive future. The stones from the buildings would not last, so no one should hold onto the things of this earth as it will pass away. Instead, Jesus encouraged His listeners to stand firm to the end.***

There will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down.” <sup>3</sup>And as he sat on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter and James and John and Andrew asked him privately, <sup>4</sup>“Tell us, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when all these things are about to be accomplished?” <sup>5</sup>And Jesus began to say to them, “See that no one leads you astray. <sup>6</sup>Many will come in my name, saying, ‘I am he!’ and they will lead many astray. <sup>7</sup>And when you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed. This must take place, but the end is not yet. <sup>8</sup>For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. These are but the beginning of the birth pains. <sup>9</sup>“But be on your guard. For they will deliver you over to councils, and you will be beaten in synagogues, and you will stand before governors and kings for my sake, to bear witness before them. <sup>10</sup>And the gospel must first be proclaimed to all nations. <sup>11</sup>And when they bring you to trial and deliver you over, do not be anxious beforehand what you are to say, but say whatever is given you in that hour, for it is not you who speak, but the Holy Spirit. <sup>12</sup>And brother will deliver brother over to death, and the father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death. <sup>13</sup>And you will be hated by all for my name’s sake. But the one who endures to the end will be saved.”



## Church Sanctuary Worship Service Guidelines


The Board of Elders has approved the following guidelines to reopen the sanctuary in response to the governor's announcement:

- **Mask wearing will be optional and will no longer be required**, but will still be available for those choosing to use them.
- Gloves will no longer be required for the ushers.
- Every pew will be available for seating.
- The Plexiglass shields will no longer be used.
- Since the cold and flu season is approaching, Pastor Jack and the Elders will again be wearing gloves and masks while giving communion as an extra level of precaution. The Common Cup will not be used at this time, and everyone will be asked to return to their pew until the service is concluded.
- Those wishing to receive communion in their cars may continue to do so.
- Attendance Cards will be placed back into the pews at a later date.
- Contemporary Service will return at a later date.
- The Offering Boxes will still be used until further notice.
- Hand sanitizer will still be available.
