If you were creating a time capsule to place in the cornerstone of a church, what would you put into the capsule? Why would you put it there? In July 2014, St. John's Lutheran Church in Orange, California, celebrated the 100th anniversary of its sanctuary. As part of the celebration, they opened the cornerstone and took out the time capsule placed there a century ago. In the capsule, among other things, they found a German Bible, a German hymnal, and a local newspaper. In these three things, you have a picture of God's work among and through His people: the Word of God, the words of His people, and the words of the world. Here is the Word of God by which God proclaims the saving work of Jesus Christ and brings salvation to all people. Here are the words of the people, their hymnbook, by which they give praise to God. And, along with the Word of God and the words of His people, one has the words of the world. A newspaper gives a glimpse of the world out of which God calls His people and to which God sends His people as part of His saving mission. With these small objects, those who laid the cornerstone offered a prayer for future generations, that they would continue in God's mission. In this cornerstone was buried a prayer that people would hear the Word of God, proclaim that Word in their world, and lift up to God their songs of praise. In our Old Testament Reading this morning, we do not have a time capsule with objects in it, but we do have a rare glimpse of what was there at the earth's foundation. Our goal is to open up this text and meditate on this song of Wisdom so that we might rejoice in the work of God.



School's Out For Summer!


GOAL: \$5,200,000


Church Pictorial Directory Sign-ups are Live!



Wisdom, present at the creation of the universe, cries out to all mankind.

¹Does not wisdom call? Does not understanding raise her voice? ²On the heights beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; ³beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries aloud: ⁴“To you, O men, I call, and my cry is to the children of man. . . .”²²“The LORD possessed me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of old. ²³Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. ²⁴When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. ²⁵Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, ²⁶before he had made the earth with its fields, or the first of the dust of the world. ²⁷When he established the heavens, I was there; when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, ²⁸when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, ²⁹when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, ³⁰then I was beside him, like a master workman, and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, ³¹rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the children of man.”

Jesus makes the claim that He is God.

"Before Abraham was born, I am!"

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the eighth chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

⁴⁸The Jews answered [Jesus], "Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?"

⁴⁹Jesus answered, "I do not have a demon, but I honor my Father, and you dishonor me. ⁵⁰Yet I do not seek my own glory; there is One who seeks it, and he is the judge. ⁵¹Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death." ⁵²The Jews said to him, "Now we know that you have a demon! Abraham died, as did the prophets, yet you say, 'If anyone keeps my word, he will never taste death.'" ⁵³Are you greater than our father Abraham, who died? And the prophets died! Who do you make yourself out to be?" ⁵⁴Jesus answered, "If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father who glorifies me, of whom you say, 'He is our God.'" ⁵⁵But you have not known him. I know him. If I were to say that I do not know him, I would be a liar like you, but I do know him and I keep his word. ⁵⁶Your father Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day. He saw it and was glad." ⁵⁷So the Jews said to him, "You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?" ⁵⁸Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am." ⁵⁹So they picked up stones to throw at him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple.
