First Sunday in Advent

December 3, 2023



The church year begins with Advent. Advent has a strong focus on the coming of the Lord, and this is reflected in the readings and prayers appointed for today. While, of course, we look forward to Jesus' coming at Christmas, the readings and prayers for the First Sunday in Advent in various ways encourage believers to look forward to the coming of the Lord on the Last Day. The Introit reminds us that our King is coming and that none who trust in Him and wait for Him will be put to shame. The Collect asks the Lord to come and rescue us from the perils of our sins and save us by His "mighty deliverance." We remember that God has come in Christ to rescue us from the perils of our sin and will deliver us from the sin-filled world. The Old Testament Reading has God's people praying that the Lord would come and rescue them from God's adversaries. The request is made not on the basis of their goodness but upon God's mercy, for "O Lord, you are our Father". In the Epistle, Paul says that despite appearances, the Corinthians are waiting for the revealing of Jesus Christ, who will sustain them to the end, guiltless in Christ on the Last Day. The Gospel is the Triumphal Entry. Jesus is God, coming to Jerusalem and to His people in order to offer up His life as a sacrifice for sin. This coming allows us to look forward to His second coming, when everyone will see Him as He is, the King of kings and Lord of lords. While Paul says that the Corinthians are eagerly waiting for Jesus to be revealed at the end of time, a reading of 1 Corinthians reveals several sins present amongst them. The sins include factionalism and divisions, sexual immorality, lawsuits amongst themselves, a lack of love, and exalting themselves and their gifts at the expense of others, to name a few of the sins identified in the letter. The Epistle strikes a harmonious chord with the themes of the other readings. An accounting is approaching; therefore, children of the light wait in sober watchfulness. The Day of the Lord's wrath is coming, yet those who wear the helmet of salvation purchased by Christ shall escape the wrath to come. Waking or sleeping, we watch alertly and rest in peace, confident in God's intervention on our behalf in His sinless Son.



PREPARATION FOR HOLY COMMUNION

Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself. 1 Corinthians 11:27-29

The following is a summary of what we believe and teach as Missouri Synod Lutheran Christians.

Because we care for you, we ask that you carefully review the following statements:

- 1. I have been baptized into the name of the one true God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:16-20
- 2. I have been instructed concerning the meaning of Holy Communion, understand the importance of self-examination prior to coming to the Lord's Supper and have made my confirmation of faith.

 1 Corinthians 11:27-29
- 3. I confess that I am a sinner in need of forgiveness. I am sorry for my sins. 1 John 1:8-9
- 4. I believe that Jesus Christ, God's Son, is my Savior from sin, death, and the power of the devil. *Romans 3:21-24*
- 5. I believe that the body and blood of Jesus Christ are really present in the bread and wine of Holy Communion, and I desire to receive Christ's body and blood, given and shed for my forgiveness. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26
- 6. If possible, so far as it depends on me, I seek to live peaceably with all. Romans 12:17-19
- 7. By the power of the Holy Spirit, I desire and intend to lead a more Godly and Christ-like life, trusting in God's promises and obeying His commands. *Galatians* 5:22-24

If you unreservedly agree with the seven points above, you are invited to come to the Lord's Supper. If you do not agree with one or more of the seven points, please refrain from participating in Holy Communion lest you sin against the body and blood of the Lord. If you agree with the seven points above but are not a member of St. John's, we welcome you to the Lord's Table and invite you to give prayerful consideration to joining our partnership in the Gospel. You are encouraged to speak with a pastor or elder prior to communing regarding any point(s) of disagreement and/or regarding the process of joining St. John's.

Gluten-Free Communion Wafers: A gluten-free communion wafer option is now available for those who are allergic. They are located in the brass cup in the middle of the communion plate.


Communion Wine: For those who have health related, or other issues with drinking alcohol, please take the purple individual communion cup. It contains all water with one drop of wine.

of service and enjoys playing golf in his free time. Together they like watching sports, but especially the Detroit Tigers and Detroit Lions.


