# **Second Sunday after the Epiphany** January 13-14, 2024



Epiphany is both a day (January 6) and a season in the calendar of the church. It is more than a few weeks that separate Christmas from Lent. It is a day and season that celebrates the shining of the true Light to all the world, including both Jew and Gentile. On Epiphany itself, those congregations that gathered heard of the visit of the Gentile Magi (Mt 2:1–12), although that event is often combined with Christmas Day. Next, we joyfully remember the Baptism of Our Lord on the First Sunday after the Epiphany, hearing the declaration that this is God's beloved Son. Now we come to the Second Sunday after the Epiphany, the Gospel reading of Jesus calling His disciples in John 1:43–51. This week, the light of Christ shines on Israel, while next week's readings show the same light shining on the Gentiles. This shining means that Christ's glory is no longer hidden. "For what had been hidden from before the foundation of the world You have made known to the nations in Your Son. In Him, being found in the substance of our mortal nature, You have manifested the fullness of Your glory." "Alleluia. You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified. Alleluia." Remarkably, God chooses to reveal the glory of Christ mostly through human beings. The mission to Israel was brought by prophets, and the mission to the world was first carried out by Israel: "I have not hidden your deliverance within my heart; I have spoken of your faithfulness and your salvation; . . . I will proclaim and tell of them"!

**Greetings from Stephen Ministry.** In 2016, we started a new generation of Stephen Ministers at St. John's. Two classes of Stephen Ministers were commissioned and extended compassionate care to many members. The year 2020 was hard for Stephen Ministry. We are looking to restart the Stephen Ministry at St. John's.

Over the next few months, there will be information announced in church as well as in the Notes & News. We will reach out to groups at St. John's to explain what Stephen Ministry does and how you as members of this church can help grow St. John's into a Stephen Ministry church. This is a process that will take some time.

We are in a phase, at this time, to recruit Stephen Ministers. Stephen Ministers are congregation members, trained by Stephen Leaders, to offer care to people who hurting. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with that person weekly for an hour.

Pastors feel confident referring people to Stephen Ministers because they know that Stephen Ministers are carefully selected, well-trained, and well-supervised caregivers. Stephen Ministry can help support our pastor in his outreach to those folks who are going through difficult times.

## **TODAY'S BIBLE READINGS**

**Old Testament Reading:** 1 Samuel 3:1-20

The boy Samuel heard a voice calling his name in the middle of the night. Not recognizing this voice as the Lord's, Samuel repeatedly went to Eli. Eli instructed Samuel to listen and respond for the Lord was calling him.

<sup>1</sup>The young man Samuel was ministering to the LORD under Eli. And the word of the LORD was rare in those days; there was no frequent vision. <sup>2</sup>At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his own place. <sup>3</sup>The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the LORD, where the ark of God was. <sup>4</sup>Then the LORD called Samuel, and he said, "Here I am!"  $^5$ and ran to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. <sup>6</sup>And the LORD called again, "Samuel!" and Samuel arose and went to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." Now Samuel did not yet know the LORD, and the word of the LORD had not yet been revealed to him. <sup>8</sup>And the LORD called Samuel again the third time. And he arose and went to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the LORD was calling the young man. <sup>9</sup>Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down, and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, LORD, for your servant hears.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place. <sup>10</sup>And the LORD came and stood, calling as at other times, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant hears." <sup>11</sup>Then the LORD said to Samuel, "Behold, I am about to do a thing in Israel at which the two ears of everyone who hears it will tingle. <sup>12</sup>On that day I will fulfill against Eli all that I have spoken concerning his house, from beginning to end. <sup>13</sup>And I declare to him that I am about to punish his house forever, for the iniquity that he knew, because his sons were blaspheming God, and he did not restrain them. <sup>14</sup>Therefore I swear to the house of Eli that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be atoned for by sacrifice or offering forever." <sup>15</sup>Samuel lay until

morning; then he opened the doors of the house of the LORD. And Samuel was afraid to tell the vision to Eli. <sup>16</sup>But Eli called Samuel and said, "Samuel, my son." And he said, "Here I am." <sup>17</sup>And Eli said, "What was it that he told you? Do not hide it from me. May God do so to you and more also if you hide anything from me of all that he told you." <sup>18</sup>So Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him. And he said, "It is the LORD. Let him do what seems good to him." <sup>19</sup>And Samuel grew, and the LORD was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground. <sup>20</sup>And all Israel from Dan to Beersheba knew that Samuel was established as a prophet of the LORD.

# **Epistle Reading:** 1 Corinthians 6:12-20

Paul addressed the issues of sexual immorality amongst the Corinthians. He emphasized that their bodies were temples of the Holy Spirit and urged them to flee from sexual sin and instead honor God with their bodies.

12"All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be enslaved by anything.

13"Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food"—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body.

14And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power.

15Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute?

Never!

16Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, "The two will become one flesh."

17But he who is joined to the Lord becomes one spirit with him.

18Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body.

19Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own,

20for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.
