Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany January 27-28, 2024



The big guestion Epiphany-tide seeks to answer is, "Who is Jesus?" Thus far, the season has answered that Jesus is the light of the world gathering the nations, the beloved Son taking His stand with sinners, the Lamb of God taking sins away, and the master angler calling and apprenticing others to be fishers (underfishers?) of men. But knowing who Jesus is, is not one piece of knowledge among others. It is THE knowledge that transforms the knower. Otherwise expressed, as the light of the world, Jesus is the light in and by which we see everything else, especially the "brother for whom Christ died". The psalmist singing thanks "in the company of the upright" contrasts sharply with the picture we get of the Corinthians, not-so-saintly saints whose rivalry and divisiveness have rendered congregational life far from delightful. After all, those caught up in keeping track of rights have precious little time for "the works of the Lord," which are "studied by all who delight in them". This is why Paul opens his letter with a study of Christ crucified for sinners—the ultimate work of the Lord—before turning to "the matters about which you wrote". Without that study, that laser focus on Jesus, there is no hope of exorcising from not-so-saintly saints like the Corinthians (and us!) the demon of self-centered loveless-ness even more destructive of Christian community than the unclean spirit Jesus exorcised in the Gospel.







Greetings from Stephen Ministry. In 2016, we started a new generation of Stephen Ministers at St. John's. Two classes of Stephen Ministers were commissioned and extended compassionate care to many members. The year 2020 was hard for Stephen Ministry. We are looking to restart the Stephen Ministry at St. John's.

Over the next few months, there will be information announced in church as well as in the Notes & News. We will reach out to groups at St. John's to explain what Stephen Ministry does and how you as members of this church can help grow St. John's into a Stephen Ministry church. This is a process that will take some time.

We are in a phase, at this time, to recruit Stephen Ministers. Stephen Ministers are congregation members, trained by Stephen Leaders, to offer care to people who hurting. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with that person weekly for an hour.

Pastors feel confident referring people to Stephen Ministers because they know that Stephen Ministers are carefully selected, well-trained, and well-supervised caregivers. Stephen Ministry can help support our pastor in his outreach to those folks who are going through difficult times.

We invite you to listen and read the information that we will present over the next weeks. Our goal is to start a new class of Stephen Ministers after Easter.

TODAY'S BIBLE READINGS

Old Testament Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Moses prophesized that God would raise up a prophet like him from among the Israelites. God warned against following false prophets and declared that any prophet who spoke His name but spoke falsely would be held accountable.

¹⁵"The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your brothers—it is to him you shall listen— ¹⁶just as you desired of the LORD your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly, when you said, 'Let me not hear again the voice of the LORD my God or see this great fire any more, lest I die.' ¹⁷And the LORD said to me, 'They are right in what they have spoken. ¹⁸I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their brothers. And I will put my words in his mouth, and he shall speak to them all that I command him. ¹⁹And whoever will not listen to my words that he shall speak in my name, I myself will require it of him. ²⁰But the prophet who presumes to speak a word in my name that I have not commanded him to speak, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that same prophet shall die.'"

Epistle Reading: 1 Corinthians 8:1-13

Paul addressed the issue of eating food sacrificed to idols. He emphasized that knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. He urged believers to prioritize love over personal rights and freedoms for the sake of others.

¹Concerning food offered to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." This "knowledge" puffs up, but love builds up. ²If anyone imagines that he knows something, he does not yet know as he ought to know. ³But if anyone loves God, he is known by God. ⁴Therefore, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "an idol has no real existence," and that "there is no God but one." ⁵For although there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as indeed there are many "gods" and many "lords"— ⁶yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist. ⁷However, not all possess this knowledge. But some, through former association with idols, eat food as really offered to an idol, and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. ⁸Food will not commend us to God. We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. ⁹But take care that this right of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. ¹⁰For if anyone sees you who have knowledge eating in an idol's temple, will he not be encouraged, if his conscience is weak, to eat food offered to idols? ¹¹And so by your knowledge this weak person is destroyed, the brother for whom Christ died. ¹²Thus, sinning against your brothers and wounding their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. ¹³Therefore, if food makes my brother stumble, I will never eat meat, lest I make my brother stumble.

Holy Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

Jesus taught in the synagogue with authority and casted out an unclean spirit from a man. The people were amazed at His power and authority. When we gather together for worship and teaching, we can experience the transformative power and authority of God's Word. Just as the people were amazed by Jesus' authority, we can be encouraged to recognize and respond to the authority of Christ in our lives, seeking His guidance and deliverance from anything that oppresses or hinders us.

- **P** The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the first chapter.
- Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

²¹They went into Capernaum, and immediately on the Sabbath [Jesus] entered the synagogue and was teaching.

²²And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes.

²³And immediately there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit. And he cried out, ²⁴"What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God." ²⁵But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" ²⁶And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying out with a loud voice, came out of him. ²⁷And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." ²⁸And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee.
