
First Sunday in Lent February 17-18, 2024



The First Sunday in Lent begins this penitential season of preparation for Holy Week and Easter with the account of a test by God and temptations by the devil. In the Old Testament Reading, Abraham is tested in the wilderness, after which God shows mercy in the face of this trial. In the Epistle, the apostle teaches that while the Lord tests to strengthen faith, "God tempts no one". As the Small Catechism reminds us, it is "the devil, the world, and our sinful nature" that deceive and mislead "into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice". The traditional Hymn of the Day for Lent 1, "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," proclaims Jesus Christ as the victor over Satan, the old evil foe. The inaugural battle for this is depicted in the traditional Gospel for Lent 1, the temptation of our Lord in the wilderness.



PREPARATION FOR HOLY COMMUNION

Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself. 1 Corinthians 11:27-29

The following is a summary of what we believe and teach as Missouri Synod Lutheran Christians.

Because we care for you, we ask that you carefully review the following statements:


- 1. I have been baptized into the name of the one true God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:16-20
- 2. I have been instructed concerning the meaning of Holy Communion, understand the importance of self-examination prior to coming to the Lord's Supper and have made my confirmation of faith.

 1 Corinthians 11:27-29
- 3. I confess that I am a sinner in need of forgiveness. I am sorry for my sins. 1 John 1:8-9
- 4. I believe that Jesus Christ, God's Son, is my Savior from sin, death, and the power of the devil. *Romans 3:21-24*
- 5. I believe that the body and blood of Jesus Christ are really present in the bread and wine of Holy Communion, and I desire to receive Christ's body and blood, given and shed for my forgiveness. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26
- 6. If possible, so far as it depends on me, I seek to live peaceably with all. Romans 12:17-19
- 7. By the power of the Holy Spirit, I desire and intend to lead a more Godly and Christ-like life, trusting in God's promises and obeying His commands. *Galatians* 5:22-24

If you unreservedly agree with the seven points above, you are invited to come to the Lord's Supper. If you do not agree with one or more of the seven points, please refrain from participating in Holy Communion lest you sin against the body and blood of the Lord. If you agree with the seven points above but are not a member of St. John's, we welcome you to the Lord's Table and invite you to give prayerful consideration to joining our partnership in the Gospel. You are encouraged to speak with a pastor or elder prior to communing regarding any point(s) of disagreement and/or regarding the process of joining St. John's.

Gluten-Free Communion Wafers: A gluten-free communion wafer option is now available for those who are allergic. They are located in the brass cup in the middle of the communion plate.

Communion Wine: For those who have health related, or other issues with drinking alcohol, please take the purple individual communion cup. It contains all water with one drop of wine.

Stephen Minister Training equips congregation members to provide a high level of emotional and spiritual care to individuals experiencing a life crisis. The training is practical, relational and interactive, covering essential caregiving topics such as these:

- Distinctively Christian caring
- Active listening
- Relating assertively
- · Dealing with difficult emotions
- Crisis theory and intervention
- Confidentiality
- · Maintaining boundaries
- Ministering during specific types of crises

Part of training, is also recognizing when to refer and involve the pastor, as well as professional counseling for intense situations.

Once Stephen Ministers have completed the 20 sessions of their initial training and are matched with care receivers, they participate in twice-monthly supervision and continuing education. This provides them with the support and guidance they need and helps them continue to grow as caregivers so they can offer the best care possible to their care receivers.



TODAY'S BIBLE READINGS

Old Testament Reading: Genesis 22:1-18

Abraham, who had waited until he was 100 years old to have a son, is now faced with the supreme test of his faith. God tells Abraham to sacrifice his son, Isaac. Abraham is obedient- and trusting. He builds an altar and places wood and Isaac upon it, ready to slay him. He is stopped at the last second and provided with a ram to sacrifice.

The Lord in Heaven, who will someday send His own son to be sacrificed, commends Abraham, and blesses him and his descendants through all the nations.

¹After these things God tested Abraham and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here am I." ²He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." 3So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac. And he cut the wood for the burnt offering and arose and went to the place of which God had told him. ⁴On the third day Abraham lifted up his eyes and saw the place from afar. ⁵Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; I and the boy will go over there and worship and come again to you." ⁶And Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son. And he took in his hand the fire and the knife. So they went both of them together. 'And Isaac said to his father Abraham, "My father!" And he said, "Here am I, my son." He said, "Behold, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" ⁸Abraham said, "God will provide for himself the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So they went both of them together. 9When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built the altar there and laid the wood in order and bound Isaac his son and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. ¹⁰Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to slaughter his son. ¹¹But the angel of the LORD called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" And he said, "Here am I." ¹²He said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him, for now I know that you fear God, seeing you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me." ¹³And Abraham lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, behind him was a ram, caught in a thicket by his horns. And Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son. ¹⁴So Abraham called the name of that place, "The LORD will

provide"; as it is said to this day, "On the mount of the LORD it shall be provided." ¹⁵And the angel of the LORD called to Abraham a second time from heaven ¹⁶and said, "By myself I have sworn, declares the LORD, because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, ¹⁷I will surely bless you, and I will surely multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore. And your offspring shall possess the gate of his enemies, ¹⁸and in your offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed, because you have obeyed my voice."

Epistle Reading: James 1:12-18

James makes clear a number of things here. Those who persevere in trials will be blessed. He also makes clear that God does not tempt anyone, but it is the evil desires of people themselves that lead to temptation, sin and ultimately death.

In the end, anything that is good and perfect comes from God.

¹²Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him. ¹³Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God," for God cannot be tempted with evil, and he himself tempts no one. ¹⁴But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. ¹⁵Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death. ¹⁶Do not be deceived, my beloved brothers. ¹⁷Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. ¹⁸Of his own will he brought us forth by the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures.

Holy Gospel: Mark 1:9-15

Mark chronicles three distinct events just in these few verses- The baptism of Jesus by John where God speaks and says He loves and is pleased with His Son. (We can see the Trinity in verses 10-11) The temptation of Jesus by Satan for forty days in the wilderness. And Jesus starting His ministry in Galilee with a very specific message of the good news, "The Kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe."
