Fourth Sunday in Lent March 9-10, 2024



Last week the lectionary gave us one of the most famous readings in all Scripture: the Ten Commandments. This week, the Fourth Sunday in Lent, the lectionary tops that: Ephesians 2:8–9 and John 3:16! So much to say. So much already said. So familiar. A bit intimidating for preaching! The Epistle is loaded! Besides the Confirmation Day standard, "For by grace you have been saved . . . ," Paul debunks every form of decision theology, "You were dead in the trespasses and sins", yet assures us, "God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ", and, lest we forget, follows grace through faith apart from works with "we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them". The Old Testament Reading directs us clearly to see Jesus lifted up on the cross just as Moses lifted up the bronze serpent in the wilderness. First, the lifting up of the Son of Man, which makes eternal life possible. Second, that God gives humanity the gift of His Son so that whoever believes in Him should have eternal life. Finally, we see the judgment or condemnation of those who do not believe in the Son and who remain in darkness of sin instead of coming into the light of Christ.


GRIEF SHARE GriefShare – Week 5: The 5th session, titled "Fearful & Overwhelmed" helps participants find a road map out of
