Fifth Sunday in Lent March 16-17, 2024



The Fifth Sunday in Lent take us to the heart of our Lord's saving work on behalf of the whole world. In the Old Testament Reading, the prophet Jeremiah succinctly lays out the Lord's promise of a new covenant. From this new covenant flows a gracious promise: "For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more". This amazing forgiveness is only made possible through the sacrificial service and reverent obedience of Jesus, our great High Priest. The Lord's promise to "remember their sin no more" is surely one of the sweetest, most comforting promises in all of Scripture. Our Lord's solemn prediction of His Passion stands in sharp contrast to the ignorant and impertinent request made by the sons of Zebedee. James and John can serve as a useful illustration of the selfish self-centeredness that infects every follower of Jesus. By contrast, as our priest, Jesus comes "to give His life as a ransom for many". He desires "not to be served but to serve." Still today, Jesus serves His Church in the waters of Holy Baptism, in Holy Absolution, in the breaking of the bread, and in the preaching and proclamation of His Holy Word. Still today, therefore, through these Means, Jesus is our great High Priest, as will be evident and emphasized in the Epistle, our sermon text today.





With a 185 year history, every detail of our past has been recorded, discovered, and explored--or has it?




- Our St. John's ancestors are buried in the three cemeteries associated with the church, including the one now Trinity's; or are they?

Epistle Reading: Hebrews 5:1-10

Jesus Christ is the ultimate High Priest, appointed by God, and our source of eternal salvation. Through Christ's suffering, we no longer need to offer sacrifices for our sins because Jesus was the ultimate sacrifice.

¹Every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. ²He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. ³Because of this he is obligated to offer sacrifice for his own sins just as he does for those of the people. ⁴And no one takes this honor for himself, but only when called by God, just as Aaron was. ⁵So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by him who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; ⁶as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, after the order of Melchizedek." ⁷In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to him who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverence. ⁸Although he was a son, he learned obedience through what he suffered. ⁹And being made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him, ¹⁰being designated by God a high priest after the order of Melchizedek.

Holy Gospel: Mark 10:32-45

Jesus prepared His disciples for His upcoming death and resurrection. James and John asked to be seated next to Jesus in glory. Jesus acknowledged the weight of their question and explained that true leadership requires selfless service and sacrificial love, a contrast from the world's pursuit of power and prestige.

³²And they were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking ahead of them. And they were amazed, and those who followed were afraid. And taking the twelve again, he began to tell them what was to happen to him, ³³saying, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death and deliver him over to the Gentiles. ³⁴And they will mock him and spit on him, and flog him and kill him. And after three days he will rise." ³⁵And James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came up to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." ³⁶And he said to them, "What do you want me to do for you?" ³⁷And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." ³⁸Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" ³⁹And they said to him, "We are able." And Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized, ⁴⁰but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." ⁴¹And when the ten heard it, they began to be indignant at James and John. ⁴²And Jesus called them to him and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. ⁴³But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. ⁴⁵For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

PREPARATION FOR HOLY COMMUNION

Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself. 1 Corinthians 11:27-29

The following is a summary of what we believe and teach as Missouri Synod Lutheran Christians.

Because we care for you, we ask that you carefully review the following statements:

- 1. I have been baptized into the name of the one true God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:16-20
- 2. I have been instructed concerning the meaning of Holy Communion, understand the importance of self-examination prior to coming to the Lord's Supper and have made my confirmation of faith. 1 Corinthians 11:27-29
- 3. I confess that I am a sinner in need of forgiveness. I am sorry for my sins. 1 John 1:8-9
- 4. I believe that Jesus Christ, God's Son, is my Savior from sin, death, and the power of the devil. Romans 3:21-24
- 5. I believe that the body and blood of Jesus Christ are really present in the bread and wine of Holy Communion, and I desire to receive Christ's body and blood, given and shed for my forgiveness. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26
- 6. If possible, so far as it depends on me, I seek to live peaceably with all. Romans 12:17-19
- 7. By the power of the Holy Spirit, I desire and intend to lead a more Godly and Christ-like life, trusting in God's promises and obeying His commands. *Galatians* 5:22-24

If you unreservedly agree with the seven points above, you are invited to come to the Lord's Supper. If you do not agree with one or more of the seven points, please refrain from participating in Holy Communion lest you sin against the body and blood of the Lord. If you agree with the seven points above but are not a member of St. John's, we welcome you to the Lord's Table and invite you to give prayerful consideration to joining our partnership in the Gospel. You are encouraged to speak with a pastor or elder prior to communing regarding any point(s) of disagreement and/or regarding the process of joining St. John's.

Gluten-Free Communion Wafers: A gluten-free communion wafer option is now available for those who are allergic. They are located in the brass cup in the middle of the communion plate.

Communion Wine: For those who have health related, or other issues with drinking alcohol, please take the purple individual communion cup. It contains all water with one drop of wine.
