Fourth Sunday of Easter April 20-21, 2024



In the Sundays of the Easter season, we celebrate the truths and promises of what the resurrected Christ offers. We are loved by God the Father, whose plan from eternity was to redeem and restore lost sheep. This is notably expressed on Good Shepherd Sunday. In our prayers and readings, the risen Jesus Christ authenticates the truth that He truly is the Good Shepherd who lovingly cares for His sheep. He does this, John shows us in both our Epistle and Gospel, not just through words but also through the willful laying down of His life for His sheep. Thus, John gives both a definition and a description of the Shepherd's love. It is intentional action motivated by love that submits to God's commands and willingness to sacrifice to the point of laying down one's life. A heart loved is a heart moved to care, as compared to a heart lacking such motivation. This is seen by example in the lives of Peter and John in the First Reading. The apostles were willing both to do a "good deed," care for a crippled man, in Jesus' name and also to testify of their Lord, even though it "greatly annoyed" the priests and Sadducees. Peter and John knew that they were known intimately by their Shepherd, and just as they were known and cared for by God, their hearts were moved to care for the crippled man and to proclaim that Christ is risen. Our Good Shepherd does not close His heart to the needs of people, but through action, He displays His care. His love motivates our hearts to see and lovingly respond to the needs of others.







What if the weather is rainy or cold? Dress for the weather. If hiking in the rain isn't for you, then plan to stay under the shelter and enjoy the company of others.





TODAY'S BIBLE READINGS

First Reading: Acts 4:1-12

Peter and John, in the Book of Acts, had healed a lame man. And while speaking with the people, the temple guards and Sadducees had them arrested. Peter and John were claiming the resurrection of the dead. Many were believing.

When the high priests questioned them the next day, Peter gives a Spirit filled message: it is by Jesus, whom they crucified and whom God raised from the dead, that the man was healed.

Peter proclaims that salvation is found in no one else but Jesus.

¹As they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple and the Sadducees came upon them, ²greatly annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. ³And they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. ⁴But many of those who had heard the word believed, and the number of the men came to about five thousand. ⁵On the next day their rulers and elders and scribes gathered together in Jerusalem, ⁶with Annas the high priest and Caiaphas and John and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. ⁷And when they had set them in the midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" ⁸Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, ⁹if we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a crippled man, by what means this man has been healed, ¹⁰let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead—by him this man is standing before you well. ¹¹This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. ¹²And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

Epistle Reading: 1 John 3:16-24

The Apostle John, continuing in his first letter, speaks of Jesus laying down His life for us- that this is how we know what love is, and that we should be ready to do the same. We love not with words but with actions. We keep God's commands and do what pleases Him. His command is to believe in His Son and to love one another.

¹⁶By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. ¹⁷But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? ¹⁸Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. ¹⁹By this we shall know that we are of the truth and reassure our heart before him; ²⁰for whenever our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and he knows everything. ²¹Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence before God; ²²and whatever we ask we receive from him, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. ²³And this is his commandment, that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. ²⁴Whoever keeps his commandments abides in him, and he in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit whom he has given us.

Holy Gospel: John 10:11-18

John, in his Gospel, quotes Jesus as "the Good Shepherd". Jesus says that the good shepherd lays his life down for the sheep. He compares His relationship to His sheep with the relationship between His Father and Him. Jesus also states that there are sheep outside of the pen that He must bring also. There shall be one flock and one shepherd.

Jesus says He will lay down His life, only to take it up again.

The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the tenth chapter.

Glory to You, O Lord.

¹¹[Jesus said:] "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹²He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. ¹⁴I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. ¹⁷For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again. ¹⁸No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father."

PREPARATION FOR HOLY COMMUNION

Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself. 1 Corinthians 11:27-29

The following is a summary of what we believe and teach as Missouri Synod Lutheran Christians.

Because we care for you, we ask that you carefully review the following statements:

- 1. I have been baptized into the name of the one true God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:16-20
- 2. I have been instructed concerning the meaning of Holy Communion, understand the importance of self-examination prior to coming to the Lord's Supper and have made my confirmation of faith. 1 Corinthians 11:27-29
- 3. I confess that I am a sinner in need of forgiveness. I am sorry for my sins. 1 John 1:8-9
- 4. I believe that Jesus Christ, God's Son, is my Savior from sin, death, and the power of the devil. *Romans 3:21-24*
- 5. I believe that the body and blood of Jesus Christ are really present in the bread and wine of Holy Communion, and I desire to receive Christ's body and blood, given and shed for my forgiveness. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26
- 6. If possible, so far as it depends on me, I seek to live peaceably with all. Romans 12:17-19
- 7. By the power of the Holy Spirit, I desire and intend to lead a more Godly and Christ-like life, trusting in God's promises and obeying His commands. *Galatians* 5:22-24

If you unreservedly agree with the seven points above, you are invited to come to the Lord's Supper. If you do not agree with one or more of the seven points, please refrain from participating in Holy Communion lest you sin against the body and blood of the Lord. If you agree with the seven points above but are not a member of St. John's, we welcome you to the Lord's Table and invite you to give prayerful consideration to joining our partnership in the Gospel. You are encouraged to speak with a pastor or elder prior to communing regarding any point(s) of disagreement and/or regarding the process of joining St. John's.

Gluten-Free Communion Wafers: A gluten-free communion wafer option is now available for those who are allergic. They are located in the brass cup in the middle of the communion plate.

Communion Wine: For those who have health related, or other issues with drinking alcohol, please take the purple individual communion cup. It contains all water with one drop of wine.
