### Ninth Sunday after Pentecost Installation of Teacher Emily Jane Rausch Anderson August 9-10, 2025



"Grant that we may walk by faith, and not by sight, in the way that leads to eternal life." These words from the Prayer of the Day set the week's theme. Each of the appointed readings addresses the call to walk by faith and not by sight. In the Old Testament Reading, Abram sees he has no children and sees Eliezer of Damascus as his most likely heir. God appears to him and reassures him that a son is indeed coming, and God credits to him as righteousness Abram's faith in the promise. The Epistle from Hebrews 11 recounts that faith of Abraham, and of Sarah as well. However imperfectly, their eyes were looking forward to the city with foundations, whose designer and builder is God. The Psalm reminds that our true strength comes not from armies and war horses we can see but from the Lord whose eye is always on us. Finally, the Gospel calls us to focus our eyes not on the things that lead to anxiety but instead to the ravens and the lilies. Ravens do not store food in barns because God cares for them. Lilies do not get anxious about how they appear to the world because they know God will array them in greater glory than King Solomon. Like them, we entrust our care to the Father, who knows our needs and provides for them all.



#### **Honoring the Legacy of Rieckers Field**



In 1958, under the leadership of Teacher E. W. Rieckers and with approval from the Voter's Assembly, the church youth group, known as the Walther League, began construction of a ball diamond on the church and school grounds of St. John's. The project was completed entirely through volunteer labor and donated materials—including lumber, poles, and even a repurposed brooder house that served as a concession stand.

Financial support for the project was secured through interest-free loans from four members, scrap drives, cleaning the fairgrounds, and contributions from church members and affiliated organizations. The total cost of \$2,790 was fully covered without using any funds from the church treasury.

Initially designed for fast-pitch softball, the field was later modified to accommodate slow-pitch leagues. Over the years, it saw the installation of new lighting, fencing, and a backstop. In 1987, the original concession stand was replaced with a new facility to better serve the growing number of visitors and teams.

In 1983, the field was officially renamed **Rieckers Field** in honor of Mr. and Mrs. E. W. Rieckers for their significant contributions to its development and upkeep. The field hosted church league softball games three nights a week from May through August, with teams from St. John's and surrounding congregations of various denominations. It also served as a recreational space for school children during recess and physical education classes.

Now, after more than six decades of use, St. John's is preparing to repurpose this area in order to expand the school facilities. As part of this transition, Rieckers Field will be decommissioned and will be relocated near the woods and soccer field following the construction of Phase 1 of our school expansion." This decision reflects the congregation's continued commitment to meeting the evolving needs of its ministry, education, and community programs.

To mark this milestone, we invite all interested to take part in the **final co-ed softball game** on **Saturday**, **August 17**, **at 1:00** during the **St. John's Church and School Picnic**. Whether you played here years ago or are new to the field, come celebrate the legacy of Rieckers Field with one last game!!

**Epistle Reading:** Hebrews 11:1-16

Faith trusts the promises of God before they happen. People of faith recognize that their ultimate hope is in a heavenly home with God.

<sup>1</sup>Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. <sup>2</sup>For by it the people of old received their commendation. <sup>3</sup>By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things that are visible. <sup>4</sup>By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks. <sup>5</sup>By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God. <sup>6</sup>And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him. <sup>7</sup>By faith Noah, being warned by God concerning events as yet unseen, in reverent fear constructed an ark for the saving of his household. By this he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith. <sup>8</sup>By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. <sup>9</sup>By faith he went to live in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. <sup>10</sup>For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God. <sup>11</sup>By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was past the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised. <sup>12</sup>Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as many as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore. <sup>13</sup>These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth. <sup>14</sup>For people who speak thus make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. <sup>15</sup>If they had been thinking of that land from which they had gone out, they would have had opportunity to return. <sup>16</sup>But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city.

Provide yourselves with moneybags that do not grow old, with a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches and no moth destroys. <sup>34</sup>For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. 35"Stay dressed for action and keep your lamps burning, 36 and be like men who are waiting for their master to come home from the wedding feast, so that they may open the door to him at once when he comes and knocks. <sup>37</sup>Blessed are those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. Truly, I say to you, he will dress himself for service and have them recline at table, and he will come and serve them. <sup>38</sup>If he comes in the second watch, or in the third, and finds them awake, blessed are those servants! <sup>39</sup>But know this, that if the master of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have left his house to be broken into. <sup>40</sup>You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."
