Admissions

St. John's Lutheran School offers classroom curriculum for Kindergarten through Grade 8. Children should be five years old by September 1st of the admission year to enroll in Kindergarten at St. John's Lutheran School.

Student enrollments are accepted on a first-come basis. Students are officially enrolled when all forms are completed and turned in and when registration fees are paid.

Our average class size is 15 students per grade

4th-8th- 25 students per grade

Tuition

The tuition charge is set annually by the Board of Education, with an average 3% increase annually. This amount is to help cover the operational cost of our school. As you consider your financial commitment to your child's education St. John's congregation supports every child who attends our school by providing for approximately 50% of the cost.

Tuition Assistance

To help with tuition and fees we also offer the SCRIP program where 50% of the proceeds can be applied to your family's account.
