
From the Board of Stewards

A couple decades ago the Board of Stewards started a program at Saint Johns called Pennies for Preachers. The idea was for individuals and families to take a jar with a plastic cover which was headed for the trash and repurpose it with a sheet of brown construction paper wrapped around it with the words "PENNIES FOR PREACHERS" on it.

After cutting a slot in the cover, it was used for collecting pennies and other loose change. On the weekend of the fourth Sunday of the month a basket was set out in front of the church and those who had full jars of pennies would bring them forward and dump them in the basket. The money collected was sent to the Joint Seminary Fund.

After a few years, there were members of our congregation who were studying for the ministry and it was decided to use those pennies to help support the sons of the congregation. After those sons of the congregation were ordained, the money was not being used so the Board of Stewards decided to discontinue the program. Since there were people who still had coins in their PENNIES FOR PREACHERS jars and were wondering what to do with them, the Board of Stewards had a change of mind and decided to restart the program. The seminaries are trying to recruit more students since there is a critical need for young men in ministry, so it seems appropriate at this time.

If you are interested in taking part in this effort, the stewards will have jars for you to use, or labels for you to put on your own jar. The next collection for Pennies for Preachers will be the weekend of June 24.



Scrip Fundraiser

Scrip is this amazing fundraiser that we do here at St. John's. You don't have to sell anything! You don't have to keep track of donations! All you have to do is shop. If you buy groceries, clothes, gas, or go out to eat, you should join Scrip. Scrip cards are gift cards you order online, at St. John's school, at the Child Development Center, or through the church office, and a percent of the order goes to St. John's Lutheran Ministries. We have Scrip cards for local stores like Festival, Culvers, and Kwik Trip, along with many national chains. Orders are due on Tuesdays by noon, and cards are available for pick up on Thursday. 

The Old Testament Genesis 3:8-15

And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. But the LORD God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" And he said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself." He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten of the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate." Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate." The LORD God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, cursed are you above all livestock and above all beasts of the field; on your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."

The Epistle 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

Since we have the same spirit of faith according to what has been written, "I believed, and so I spoke," we also believe, and so we also speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. So we do not lose heart. Though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the

things that are unseen are eternal. For we know that if the tent, which is our earthly home, is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

The Holy Gospel Mark 3:20-35

Then he went home, and the crowd gathered again, so that they could not even eat. And when his family heard it, they went out to seize him, for they were saying, "He is out of his mind." And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem were saying, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," and "by the prince of demons he casts out the demons." And he called them to him and said to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but is coming to an end. But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his goods, unless he first binds the strong man. Then indeed he may plunder his house. "Truly, I say to you, all sins will be forgiven the children of man, and whatever blasphemies they utter, but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin"— for they had said, "He has an unclean spirit." And his mother and his brothers came, and standing outside they sent to him and called him. And a crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside, seeking you." And he answered them, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking about at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God, he is my brother and sister and mother."
