St. Paul writes of this when he says, "But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved... For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast" (Ephesians 2: 5, 8-9). We have been set free by our Lord because of His great love for us. There is absolutely nothing that we must do to earn that forgiveness. We don't have to participate in the process. We don't have to do some ritualistic activity to be saved. **WE ARE FREE!**

This freedom is greater than any freedom that can be won by man. It should cause us to express boundless joy as we realize that there is absolutely nothing that must be done to earn forgiveness. We can say with the great hymn writer:

He lives, all glory to his name!
He lives, my Savior till the same.
What joy this blest assurance give.
I know that my Redeemer Lives!

As we finish this month celebrating the gift of God's Word that is ours, we need to remember that this word is tied to love that God has poured out on us. John wrote this when he said," See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And

What to expect on this glorious day of visiting with our grandparents and special guest.


- * Please park in the church/school parking lot.


