

#### From the Principal's Pen...

During the last several weeks as I drive home, I pass many farm fields. These fields have been there all summer. I have watched as they grew slowly in the early months of summer due to the drought but suddenly burst into growth in the later part of the season as rain became more prevalent. Having grown up in the big city, farms are always amazing to me. The natural cycle of planting, growth, and harvest occur every year. Right now, I see semi-trucks parked in the fields as they download the crop from the combines and take the corn or soybeans to market. Even in the less productive years, thousands of bushels are produced.

David wrote of this when he said, "Rain in abundance, O God, you shed abroad; you restored your inheritance as it languished; your flock found a dwelling in it; in your goodness, O God, you provided for the needy" (Psalm 68:9-10). By His presence in the world, He connects with us. Paul says, "For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So, they are without excuse." (Romans 1:20).

God desires all to be saved. Paul writes, "This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, <sup>4</sup> who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:3-4). His grace is ever flowing.

approach Thanksgiving later this month, let us give thanks to God for the wonderful blessings He gives us every day and for the salvation we have through Jesus Christ our Savior.




