#### From the Principal's Pen...

Many times, in our lives we can go for a long stretch of time with nothing but good news. People like the job we are doing, the children are doing well in school, the boss seems to be happy, and even your dog brings your paper without tearing it to shreds. Life just seems like it is rolling along with no cares in the world.

Then everything seems to change. The children begin to fight constantly over meaningless issues. The teacher calls with concern regarding the progress or behavior of one of your children. The boss suddenly seems overly demanding. The bills seem to pile up and yes, the dog doesn't seem to remember that it is to go outside before its morning break. Life is out of control. We seem to be drowning in the events of our lives.

This type of pattern is not unique to us or our generation. In Matthew chapter 8, the apostle describes a whole series of miracles that had been happening. The disciples had witnessed cleansing of leprosy, healing of the Centurions daughter, and even the casting out of demons. They listened as Jesus spoke the words of The Sermon on The Mount and described a Christian's life in the new kingdom of God. The life of the disciples seemed to be flawless.

Then they stepped into the boat. For the disciples, this was as normal as getting on a bike and riding across town. They had done it many times before. This time was different. A storm seemed to come out of nowhere. The waves crashed over the side of the boat. The disciples feared they were finished. There Jesus was sleeping in the back of the boat. What must have gone through their minds as they struggled to stay afloat?

Finally, out of desperation, they went and woke him saying, "Save us, Lord; we are perishing." (Matt. 8:25 ESV) Jesus awoke and first rebuked them not for asking but because of their lack of faith. Then immediately he stood and rebuked the waves and the storm ended. Picture in your mind the reaction the disciples must have had. Shock, surprise, and even fear must have poured through their thoughts. The men marveled, saying, "What sort of man is this, that even winds and sea obey him? (v.27)

Do we many times try to handle our problems the way the disciples did? Do we try to bail the water out of the sinking ship of our lives only to find that we are losing the battle? Would Jesus' question to his disciples apply to you?

Jesus stands in our boat and rebukes the waves of troubles that come after us. He calms the seas with all its problems by the sheer force of His Word. The peace that ensues is beyond anything that one can



imagine. He brings solitude in the midst of our chaos. Even though the troubles may not disappear, we have peace because we know the Good Shepherd stands there at our side.

When this happens, there is only one response. It is the same response that the disciples had. "Even the winds and the waves obey him." How awesome it is to have a God who can reach into our turmoil and calm whatever it is. He does have the power! He does promise to be there! Let's praise and thank Him for it!
