

#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S PEN...

There comes a time in each person's life when he/she must step out from the security of some protection and venture into the world. This is no better illustrated then when a parent leaves a child at our school for the very first time. For many children, this is the first time they have seen their parents walk away from them outside of the security of their home. They may have had baby-sitters before, but now they are in a strange setting with new adults and many new peers around them. At that point, the child ventures out into the great unknown with great fear and doubt.



In Mark chapter 8 the disciples reached a point where they felt Jesus was pushing them into the world. Up to this point in their relationship with Jesus, their life had been a virtual kindergarten. They had joyfully followed this man believing that He was the Messiah. They had listened at His feet as Jesus boldly proclaimed the coming of the kingdom of God. Now the message changed. In verse thirty-one it says, "and He (Jesus) began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and the scribes and be killed." The lovely, gracious, powerful Christ, who was well on His way toward becoming Israel's king, was now predicting His own execution.

Not only was He talking of His own demise, but our Lord was also calling on them for commitment and sacrifice. "If anyone would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." (vs. 34) They too would be called on to sacrifice.

As we move through the coming weeks, we will once again be reminded that our Lord calls us to deny ourselves and call on Him. The season of Lent is a time to remember that our existence here on this earth is only temporary and all that we have will turn to nothing.

This would be a horribly depressing message if it were not for the cross standing majestically over our lives. Through Jesus Christ we claim the forgiveness purchased on that cross and sealed through His resurrection from the dead. As St. Paul says, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, danger, or sword? No in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us." (Romans 8:35,37) Through Christ's sacrifice we become heirs

of eternal life.






