- 3) Regarding the Lord's Supper today: If you are not a confirmed member of St. John's congregation or a congregation of The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, please speak to the pastor before communing. Pastor is readily available in the narthex before worship for this conversation. For those with medical need, the center section of the individual cup trays is filled with cups of grape juice (darker color). For those who have a gluten intolerance, gluten-free wafers are available. Share your need as you come forward to the older.
- **4)** Children are invited to come forward to the altar while the Lord's Supper is distributed; encourage them to bow their heads and fold their hands. While there, they will receive a Baptismal blessing from the Pastor.
- 5) We ask that if you have a mobile device, please silence it during the worship service.

Prayer Before Worship



Sermon Reflections	



This weekend, we are reminded that life does not consist in the abundance of possessions, but in Christ alone. Earthly wealth, toil, and striving apart from God are vanity—a chasing after the wind (Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12–14; 2:18–26). Our sinful hearts are prone to covetousness, which is idolatry (Colossians 3:5), but God calls us to seek the things that are above, where Christ is.

In Him, we are raised to a new life—one that is hidden with Christ in God and rich with eternal treasures. Jesus, who is our life, teaches us not to store up treasures for ourselves, but to **be rich toward God** through faith in Him (Luke 12:21).


Advent by Candlelight


We are looking for volunteers to help organize and set up for our upcoming Advent by Candlelight. If you
