Ponderings from the Pew

On a trip through the Lake Tahoe, Truckee, Reno area I was reminded of Luke 19:40. This is where Jesus rode into Jerusalem and the Pharisees wanted Him to rebuke the people shouting praises for Him. Jesus replied, "I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out." Overwhelmed by the awesome beauty of God's creation, it seemed to me that indeed the rocks of the mountains do just that. They proclaim the glory of their Creator. Psalm 19 says, "The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims His handiwork. Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge. There is no speech, nor are there words, whose voice is not heard. Their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world." Who can view such beauty on earth and not "hear" the rocks, rivers, oceans, trees, canyons, and lakes literally proclaim the awesome glory of God?

Psalm 50:6 says, "The heavens declare His righteousness, for God Himself is Judge!" Who are we to doubt His power? In verse I, "The Mighty One, God the Lord, speaks and summons the earth from the rising of the sun to its setting." Who are we to fail to praise Him when the very earth He formed with His hands so thoroughly declares His majesty? "When I look at Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, the moon and the stars, which You have set in place, what is man that You are mindful of him and the son of man that You care for him?" (Psalm 8:3-4) Yet, God is more than mindful of us. He has given humans dominion over the works of His hand. He created such beauty for us.

But earth is not heaven, and evil exists here as Revelation 12:12 reminds us, "Therefore, rejoice, O heavens and you who dwell in them! But woe to you, O earth and sea, for the devil has come down to you in great wrath, because he knows that his time is short!...(17) Then the dragon became furious with the woman and went off to make war on the rest of her offspring, on those who keep the commandments of God and hold to the testimony of Jesus." We suffer. We know great loss and great pain. Yet, God is with us, and He is merciful and gracious, and, even in the valley of the shadow of death, we know He is there.

Seek God where He may be found; in His temple and in His glorious creation. "I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the Lord Who made heaven and earth. He will not let your feet be moved; He who keeps you will not slumber. ... The Lord is your keeper; the

Lord is your shade on your right hand. The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night. The Lord will keep you from all evil; He will keep your life. The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore" (Psalm 121). He will keep us here on earth and when He finally calls us home to Him.

Stewardship Corner—A New Start

The soloist began to sing a special song during the worship service. It was awful! She had somehow started on the wrong note, terribly out of tune with the accompanist. She abruptly stopped and announced she needed a new start. She then began anew with a beautiful addition to the morning worship. Had she tried to limp through the first try, people would have remembered the off-key solo. Instead, by her second start, the congregation was assisted in their worship of the Lord.



That is the way it is with our lives, too. Our first start in life, our birth, is awful because of sin. We are born with a sin condition that makes it impossible for us to please God no matter how hard we try. We are captive to disobedience of God and His Law, to "doing it our way" and the passions of sin. But unlike the soloist we cannot even recognize we are out of tune with God.

Then it is God Who comes to us by His Word to show us our sin. It is He Who offers us grace and forgiveness through faith in Jesus Christ. It is He Who by His Holy Spirit gives us that new start through Baptism. Through Baptism, we are united to Christ. Because Christ died for our sins, we are baptized into the death of sin with Him, that we may be raised to new life with Him.



The Apostle Paul tells us, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold the new has come." (2 Corinthians 5:17). God has redeemed and restored us into new people who live under the Lordship of Christ. We are given new hearts and a new nature. Through faith that God gives us, we live in Christ and for Him, and through faith, we serve Christ by serving others.

Now our lives can be pleasing to God, like the soloist's second start. Not because of our work but because of the power of God's gracious gift to us, Holy Baptism.





Release Time Has Revamped Curriculum for This Year

We're preparing for the start of Release Time classes on September 26. The Release Time teachers spent the summer going through the lessons and switching all the Bible references from NIV (New International Version) to ESV (English Standard Version) since we put new ESV Bibles in the classrooms.

Wondering what Release Time is? Minnesota law allows children to be "released" from school for one hour a week for religious instruction. Here in Park Rapids, it's been Wednesday mornings for decades. There are two sessions. The first session 5-8th graders come from 8:25—9:15 a.m. They're bussed back

to school and then the I-4th graders come from 9:30—10:20 a.m. While they're here they learn Bible stories, Bible history and even about Martin Luther. At Christmas they put on a Christmas play. There's movies and treats on Wednesdays close to holidays like Christmas and Easter. Third graders receive a Bible of their very own.

We are truly blessed to be able to offer this program. For many of the children in the program, this is only time they hear about God's love for them. Please keep our teachers and students in your prayers this coming year.

Christian Education: Release Time: No report this month.

<u>Sunday School</u>: A Sunday School teachers meeting will be held on August 14. The first day of Sunday School will be September 9.

VBS: No report this month.

Preschool: Kim Neubauer submitted a report that was shared with the board. So far enrollment for next year is 39; 46 would be full with our current staffing option. There are 28 4's and 11 3's. Wednesday, August 15, from 10:00 - 1:00 and 5:00 - 7:00 will be Open House and Registration Day. Both pastors will attend and Shelley Lof will assist parents. Ads have been placed in the Enterprise, posters have been put in churches and area businesses, 2 large banners are up outside church, small signs are up around town and in member's yards. Postcards were sent to St. Johns members who have preschool age children inviting them to the open house and to preschool. Supply needs board is up. Preschool Committee will meet at the end of the month.

New Business: We looked at information about 'Bring It Home,' a new Bible literacy program to get people to read Bible stories in their homes. We would like the pastors to include information about the program during the announcements made in worship.

We discussed VBS, wondering if: it should be later in the year; on summer evenings; and should it involve parents. We want to find out when other churches offer VBS. We will work on a note and survey in January.

Ginny Ranisate will put together an insert and information for the newsletter about various Bible study opportunities available for all ages at St.

Johns. We would like it to include Sunday school, Bring It Home, ladies groups, men's club, youth, and any other groups that meet during the week or month and have Bible studies. We want to put up posters in church listing all offerings.

We began preliminary work on the budget for next year.

Church Properties: Decided to keep old riding lawn mower for doing the ditch and back 40 until it dies. Possibly work on fixing back door before winter if there is money available. Okay for Evangelism Board to pursue replacing benches in front entry. Cleaned up playground area and fixed some things for ABC Open House. Working on wireless microphones. Started working on 2019 budget. Working on ideas for expanding pastor pictures in social hall. Discussed snow stops over sacristy door.

Elders: Worked on assisting elders. Talked with Sarah Newton about deaconess duties. Discussed continuing education and schedule with Pastor Newton. Reviewed health insurance information for staff.

Evangelism: Discussion on the time (5:00 p.m.) of our board meetings took place. The board wishes to consider the schedules of the pastors when deciding about whether or not this practice of meeting prior to the general board assembly should continue. Connie Fondow will approach the pastors on this issue and report back to the board.

There will be about 10-11 new confirmation students in the fall. New mentors are needed. Connie will send a list out to board members with the names of current and past mentors.

Ten "My Church" books were ordered from Shutterfly for the baptismal baskets. We



transitioned to a soft cover book to assist with lowering the cost.

Kathy Henry will notify the board about the outcome of the meeting that she will be attending involving the Intervention Center staff/board. This information will hopefully assist us in making recommendations and decisions concerning "Dawn's Room" funds that are currently available.

We are considering hosting a Saturday workshop organized and presented by staff from the MN North District office. This workshop would center around equipping members of St. Johns with tools needed for effectively approaching inactive members of the congregation. We share a concern for retaining our members.

Replacement of outside benches – The majority of the board members felt that this project would not fall under the responsibilities of evangelism. We brainstormed other ideas for possibly obtaining new seating at the outside front door.

Future evangelism projects:

The board will inquire about obtaining a list of St. Johns members who will be attending college in the fall. We would like to be able to locate addresses for these students and then send them small care packages a couple time a year in an attempt to help keep them interested in staying connected with St. Johns.

The board is considering organizing a group to assist with Ruby's Pantry in September.

Parish Fellowship: Old Business:

Our board assisted in the planning and clean up for the meal to welcome and install our new pastor, Rev. Joel Newton and his wife Sarah as our deaconess on Sunday, June 24. Laurie Kimball catered the meal that followed the 9:30 a.m. service.

New Business:

There will be a reception held on Sunday, August 19 to honor Bernice Hinds for her many years of service as our first parish nurse. Our board will take care of ordering the cake and serve the refreshments between services that Sunday. We will ask the Evening Guild ladies that are assigned to serve that Sunday to help us serve.

There will be a New Member Welcome held this fall, probably some Sunday in October. We typically have a potluck lunch following the 10:30 a.m. service. The pastors will settle on the date.

The church council discussed at the July meeting the formation of a kitchen remodeling planning committee. They are looking for interested people to serve on this committee. Elayne Luiken volunteered to serve on it as a representative of the Fellowship Board.

Our board voted on and approved the budget for 2019. It will be the same as this year - \$550.

Public Relations and Stewardship: did not meet.

Young People: Discussed recent trip tubing down the Crow Wing. Thanks to Larry Hetrick for driving, Jill Hartig, Brandi Backmann, and Pastor Neubauer for chaperoning.

Discussed upcoming trip to Evergreen Park August 28.

Discussed preparation plans for the National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis, July 11-15, 2019. We'll need \$100ish commitments for each youth planning to attend. We'll have more details later about the Selbständige Evangelisch-Lutherische Kirche youth group whom we'll host for the time


