Blood Drive This Month



Ponderings from the Pew



Balance. One of today's trends is a push for work/life balance. Employees juggling work commitments with home and family commitments. Balance. A gymnast learns to keep her balance on a balance beam while performing difficult leaps, flips, and movements. Balance. It is second nature for bookkeepers to make sure their financial records balance between accounts. Balance. Tight rope walkers find their center of balance to walk the wire without falling. Balance. Balance scales are used to measure mass. Basically, balance means to have the same weight or mass on both sides.

A search of Biblegateway.com reveals the use of the word balance/s in the Old Testament 13 times. 13? How ironic. I was surprised it was there at all. Job 31:6, "Let me be weighed in a just balance, and let God know my integrity!" The soul of a Christian struggles to keep to the narrow path laid out before him; to keep an even keel in his life; to balance his life's journey with God's word and grace. It is sadly evident in politics we are a nation swinging too far to either one side or the other. Personally, the wellness movement gives the impression we are a nation striving to be the best we can be. But are we accomplishing our goal? Spiritually, we are looking everywhere but churches to find a higher power that serves our purpose. We have stopped trusting God and started demanding He do what we expect of Him. We are desperately out of balance.

So, what do we do? Psalm 62:1 says it all, "For God alone my soul waits in silence; from Him comes my salvation." For God alone can bring balance. So many times, the Bible tells us the only answer we need. "I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the Lord, Who made heaven and earth," (Psalm 121:1-3). "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God," (Colossians 3:1-3). "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own

understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make straight your paths," (Proverbs 3:5).

Balance in life and spirit are only attained through God's grace. True peace comes only in knowing God has us in His keeping. As John 1:17 says, "For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ." Seek your balance in Christ our Lord.

"And now I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified," (Acts 20:32).

Stewardship Corner—Love One Another



God's nature is love. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). Jesus tells us to love others as He has loved us (John 15:12). Love is the heart of the Gospel. The Apostle Paul, who wrote much of the New Testament, wrote again and again about Christ's love for us and our need to love Him by loving others. In his letter to the people in Corinth, Paul devotes a whole chapter to describe love (I Corinthians 13).

When Sir Ernest Shackleton, an Irish-born British explorer of the Artic, was asked to describe his most terrible moment in the Artic, he said it occurred one night when he and the other members of his expedition were huddled together in a barren hut, trying to sleep. They had divided up the last of their food rations. There was nothing more to divide.

Then in the cold darkness, Sir Ernest heard a quiet movement. He turned and saw one of the men reach over and pick up the provision bag of the man beside him. Shackleton said he lived through an eternity of suspense the next few moments. He would have trusted his life to this



man. Was he now turning out to be a thief who would steal his comrade's last morsel of food? Then Shackleton saw the man open his provision bag, take out his last biscuit, and place it in the bag of his sleeping friend. Shackleton said, "I felt I had witnessed a secret moment between that man and God."



Because God has first loved us (I John 4:19), each of us can be that person who gives away the last of our food. We can show love to one another in such a way, openly or in secret, that we are raised above the level of mere mortals to become more like our Creator. That is truly the imitation of God. As Jesus loved without expectation of that love being reciprocated, so we can learn to love not caring if we receive love in return. We can demonstrate our love by what we say and do. As we love others, we will become "little Christs." As Paul tells us: "Love one another with brotherly affection" (Romans 12:10). May Christ's love in us overflow to others.

Board



Christian Education:

Release Time: Pastor Neubauer reported that 132 students are expected on Wednesday.

Sunday School: Brandi Backmann reported that Rally Day was September 9. Activities were led by Pastor Newton with help from Shelley Lof and Ruth Knaack. On September 16 we began using the new curriculum. So far the response has been positive from teachers and students. We still need classroom helpers, especially in the 1st - 3rd classroom. Average attendance for the first three weeks was 36 students.

VBS: No report this month.

Preschool: Kim Neubauer reported that enrollment for this year is 41, there are ten in the 3-4 year old class and 31 in other classes during the week. A state inspection will be done during the fourth quarter of the year and paperwork for that was due on October 5. The Preschool Committee met on September 18 to discuss enrollment and the budget. Their recommendations were approved under new business.

Pastor's Report: Sunday morning Bible class is taught by Pastor Neubauer and has an attendance of about 30. Pastor Neubauer's Tuesday morning class involves 8-16 people and is studying the book of Ephesians. Sarah Newton leads a Sunday morning class of 10-12 and they study the Lord's Prayer. Pastor Neumann has a class on Wednesday morning. Confirmation class meets together this year and is using the 7th grade material.

Old Business: We finalized the budget for next year. Lori Griess told us that progress is being made on getting a stage for the Christmas program.

New Business: Approved the Preschool Committee recommendation to leave the budget amount for

next year at \$16,500 and to ask the treasurer to take only \$500 from ABC's savings account and the rest from the budget amount to cover expenses starting in September.

We discussed costs of Focus on the Family inserts and recommend that the church resume including them in the bulletin every month. Motion made, seconded and carried to approve and submit our 2019 budget.

Church Properties: One minor electrical problem to be fixed this fall. North door extension done this fall before it gets real cold to allow both doors to close. Set budget for 2019. Office cabinets to be refaced.

Elders: Heard reports from the pastors and Sarah Newton. Worked on assisting elders. Finalized 2019 budget items.

Evangelism: Confirmation mentors have been secured and letters to both the confirmands and mentors have been mailed.

The mentor/confirmand pizza party will take place on October 24 after confirmation class. Deb Luther and Kathy Henry will coordinate this event. The pastors will take care of the "mixer" activity.

Dawn Lachmiller will attempt to call parents of some of the possible college student members to find out addresses for sending care packages.

Sixty patriotic key chains will be taken to the Legion to be distributed to area veterans. A card is attached with information about St. Johns service times.

The pastors will review the material for "Every One His Witness" and let the board know when possible dates would be appropriate for leading this Bible study during one of the 2019 winter months.

Doug Kingsley will once again lead the Christmas community gifting program at St. Johns.

The pastors will inform the congregation about the new cards available in the pew racks. These informational cards will assist the elders and pastors with knowing when we have members who may be missing Sunday service due to illness or other concerns so that a "caring" call may be initiated.

New Business:

board members will each bake two dozen cupcakes. We'll get together at church on Saturday, October 27 at 10:00 a.m. to frost them. Elayne will also purchase some kuchens from Pop and Chops (in Nevis).

Christmas decorating will be on Monday, November 26, starting at 9:00 a.m. Our board will furnish rolls and coffee.

Cookies and Carols will be Sunday, December 16 between services.

Public Relations: did not meet.

Stewardship: did not meet.
