God knew!



So get excited; in just a two short weeks, we'll all have the opportunity to meet Pastor Ackermann and the five youth traveling from Germany! Pastor Ackermann will be preaching at both services on July 7, and all the youth will be in attendance. Let's make them feel welcome!

And The Youth are Going



After that, they'll return home, well-prepared (after a little sleep, of course) to put what they've learned into practice and to continue growing closer to our Lord, Jesus Christ!


Stewardship Corner—Glorifying God with Our Time

It seems that, as we grow older, we can better understand what James was saying in chapter four, verse 14 of his letter: "For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes." Time does go by quickly, especially as we age. James is telling us that, in the span of eternity, our time on earth is rather insignificant. We are a mere dot on the calendar of time.

In reading God's Word, it is clear, however, that God is more interested in what we do with our time than the length of time that He gives us. As God's children, our focus shouldn't be on asking God for longer lives, but, rather, we should be more interested in asking Him and ourselves the question: "What can I do with my time that will please Him and give Him the glory that He deserves?" First and foremost, God wants us to spend our time in serving and glorifying Him. In speaking to the Corinthians, the Apostle Paul wrote, "So whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God" (I Corinthians 10:30). We can give God glory by dedicating our daily tasks to Him. Our hands and feet can be doing routine and mundane things, but our hearts and minds can be focused on the Lord. To the Colossians Paul wrote, "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men" (Colossians 3:23). In all that we do, God is to be part of our activities.

Paul exhorted the people in Philippi to "...work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God Who works in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure" (Philippians 2:12-13). God equips and enables us through the working of the Holy Spirit to use our time in doing His will. We demonstrate God's grace at work within us as we do His will by serving Him through serving others.

God wants us to make the most of our time. In the words of the psalmist, we pray "So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12). With God's wisdom, we can use well the time God has given us. As Paul wrote, "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil" (Ephesians 5:15-16). By wisely using our time to the glory and honor of God, we can live this life abundantly.



Youth – shoveled off Dawn Lachmiller's roof as a fundraiser – Thanks, Dawn! Youth Bible study breakfast (concluded the school schedule, taking a break for the summer). Last time there were seven attending – three youth and four adults. Great conversation. Family Night Bonfires are forthcoming - June 11 and 25, July 9 and 23 and August 13 -- supper, games, devotion, rain or shine, anyone and everyone is invited.

Motion Larry Hetrick to accept Pastor/Deaconess reports – second Jody Yliniemi – carried.

Old/New Business

Board Elections – Presented the printed list of nominees of Church Board Members 2019-2021. Motion to accept/approve all nominations – Tim Huwe – second Marty Steffel. Motion carried.

Kitchen Remodel - Connie Fondow presented a detailed plan of the kitchen remodel project to the voters including estimates and/or bids from several businesses/contractors to complete the project. The kitchen remodel committee consisted of Connie Fondow, Chairman; Brad Dahn, Church Properties; Mike Poole, Lutheran Laymen's League; Pat Stearns, Ladies Aid; Elayne Luiken, Evening Guild; Rod Helm, Church Executive Director. After the presentation voters posed questions -- followed by discussion.

Motion by Connie Fondow – second Jody Yliniemi. St. Johns should follow the kitchen renovation plans as formulated by the committee and designated contractors. The congregation will utilize Citizen's National Bank of Park Rapids for a 5-year unsecured fixed loan at the rate of 4.125% for \$60,000.

Kathy Henry spoke about securing a loan from Citizens. She recommended that we apply for a line of credit up to \$60,000 at a rate of 4.125%. She also said that the congregation could move \$60,000 from our LCEF account to a 5 year Certificate of Deposit at Citizens at a rate of 1% (same as we are getting through LCEF) to use as collateral for the loan. This would drop the interest rate to 3%. If we found we needed the funds for some other purpose in the future, we could refinance the loan.

Jody Yliniemi suggested that we borrow the money from ourselves and pay it back at a rate of 3%. This option was also discussed.



Next, it was suggested that the voters approve the project and cost then have the kitchen committee and various financial people from the congregation decide on how to finance it. The general opinion expressed by the assembly was that this would be acceptable.

Due to the late hour and bad weather, the vote was finally called on the original motion. Paper vote was taken with 50 yes and 1 no --- Motion carried.

Motion by Connie Fondow -- second Jerry Grudem. The Board of Church Properties will be authorized to handle the logistics of the sale of the current range/oven and freezer at the appropriate time. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned.

- ♦ This is the 67th regular convention of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.
- ♦ It's being held July 20-25 in Tampa, Florida.
- ◆ Each circuit sends a pastoral delegate and a lay delegate. Ours are Pastor Matthew Vrudny from Immanuel, Walker and Charles Deustchmann from First English, Dorset. They were chosen at a circuit forum last fall. In case you're wondering our circuit also includes Gethsemane (Snellman), Christ (Wolf Lake) Redeemer (Menahga) and St. Johns (Akeley).
- ♦ Each congregation also chooses a pastor and lay person to vote for the synodical president. Pastor Neubauer and Roger Just were chosen to fill these roles. The voting process has moved online rather than by paper ballot and took place in early June. Pastor Neubauer and Roger cast their votes for Rev. Matthew Harrison who is the current president of the Synod. He has held the position since 2010. He has received the majority of votes and will continue as president for the next term.
- We're sending \$276.25 to the convention as our gift for the National Offering. These funds came from a door offering collected on June 16.
