

Stewardship Corner—Living Life at its Best

Jesus tells us that He came in order for us to have life and have it more abundantly (John 10:10). Just as we as parents are pleased and thrilled to see our children thrive and do well in their careers, with their families, and in their churches, our Heavenly Father, in a much more profound way, is pleased that we are experiencing **life at its best** in the years, months, and days that God has given us. We are His children and His amazing love for us was shown to us on the cross where Christ won for us the forgiveness of sins and eternal life through faith in Him. This gift empowers us to live abundantly. It is God's desire that we live abundant lives. Just as we want the best for our children,



He wants the best for us. He is so pleased when we walk by faith in ways of obedience, compassion, selflessness, and seek to follow His ways. By God's grace, we can be contented people who live **life at its best** aware of His presence and enjoying the intimacy of His companionship. **Life at its best** is the rich life that God wants for us.

In contrast to the abundant life that Jesus came to give us, we find Satan (thief) doing all he can to make us live life at its worst. "The thief comes only to steal, kill, and destroy" (Johns 10:10a). Satan comes to steal our joy, kill our faith, and destroy our hope. He attempts to separate us from Jesus, and he wants us to live lives of despair and gloom.



In this tenth chapter of John, Jesus tells us that He is our Good Shepherd. As our Shepherd, He feeds us, guides us, and takes care of our needs. He even lays down His life for us! What a humbling and staggering thought that Jesus the Creator of the universe wants to be our Shepherd! He wants us to be His children in spite of our sinful and evil ways. He invites us to follow Him and to receive His affection and attention. He tells us that we, His sheep, know His voice and follow Him. As part of His flock or family, we acknowledge His authority and seek to follow His direction. Out of gratitude we attempt to live lives that please him through our serving, witnessing, and giving. 


Kitchen Nearing Completion

Adopt-a-Chap: We have received an APO address for Chaplain Bain. We are waiting to hear about any specific soldier needs. The address and list of supply needs will be posted in upcoming bulletins and the newsletter.

BINGO at Diamond Willow: Deb Luther will begin to fill in the monthly spots for BINGO facilitators. *Portals of Prayer* will be taken for those participants who would like to use them.

Jan Belshan will follow up on finding out if there are any St. Johns college bound students for the upcoming school year.

Linda Leckner will check on the tract rack needs.

The Board of Evangelism will furnish Pastor Newton with a seasonal pass to Panther sporting events.

The board will revisit the idea of becoming involved in a visitation schedule for shut in members of the congregation. The pastors will guide us.

The board will purchase Bibles for the county jail (\$300) and will continue to do so on a yearly basis beginning each January. The number of Bibles to be purchased will be determined in one of our upcoming fall meetings.

The board's budget request amount for 2020 will be discussed at the September meeting.

There are no caring cards to be sent out due to the fact that the pastors are discussing their approach for ministry to inactives.

Board members will assist with Pastor Appreciation Sunday in October as needed.

New Business:

Stewardship: The first issue presented for discussion was the purchase of a tv for the confirmation classes. Pastor Neubauer stated that he could get a 42" tv from Target for \$265 plus tax (could possibly get the tax exempted). This purchase along with a previously approved amount of up to \$1200 for a projector will be paid from Richard Haberer annuity funds which has a balance of \$1,441. Any overage from the tv and projector will be paid from Thrivent Choice Funds.

The bus is in need of major repairs on the back brakes. The estimated cost of the repairs is \$2,500, possibly more. This matter was referred to the Church Properties Board for consideration and payment.

The 2020 budget for the Stewardship Board will be increased to \$1,350 from \$1,000. The additional monies are needed for bank costs associated with the online collection option.

Young People: We considered our budget, and it looks as though \$2,000 ought still to be enough for us to ask for next year.

Evergreen Park is scheduled for August 27 from 1-4:30 p.m. (grades 5-12). Cost is \$5/person.
