Stewardship Corner—The Pull of the Heart from God and from the World


Jesus said, "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one an despise the other. You cannot serve God and money" (Matthew 6:24). We are caught between two masters and two distinct, opposing ways of life, the ways of the world which focus on money and what money can buy and God's ways. The world builds life on the

accumulation of material possessions for today, whereas God wants us to have a loving and devoted relationship with Him through Jesus and to develop relationships with others.

God's Word does not condemn the possession of material stuff, but Scripture reminds us that these are gifts of God to sustain our lives and to help those in need and to extend God's kingdom. Our possessions are to be accepted with thanksgiving and used wisely. Our Christian faith draws us away from the self-oriented values of our society. God calls us to abandon self-centered lives and value systems, as we recognize ourselves as managers of all that He has given to us. God admonishes waste and careless destruction of His resources by pollution and injustice caused by people. While sin brought destructive forces into our lives such as earthquakes, floods, tornadoes and hurricanes, these remind us to stay close to God and depend on His grace, love and mercy for our needs. They are all reminders of the brevity of life and that we are foreigners on earth and that heaven is our true.

life and that we are foreigners on earth and that heaven is our true home. People who make possessions and money their security and who desire more than they need will be disappointed: "Your riches have rotted and your garments are moth-eaten. Your gold and silver have corroded, and their corrosion will be evidence against you and will eat your flesh like fire. You have laid up treasure in the last days" (James 5:2-3). Their riches gave evidence to their greed for which they were judged.

The attractiveness of the material world makes us blind to the glory of God all around us which fills heaven and earth. Some have nothing left to quiet their own worries and feelings, except chemicals or alcohol which drug their minds from reality. The consumer world is a tempting merry-go-round that makes no sense. The world promises things that only God can provide and give! No matter how dazzling the things of this world appear, they offer no long-lasting peace, joy, and hope. God alone meets our needs by the riches of His glory (Phil.4:19), and we need to remember the warning that Luke shared in his Gospel: "For what good does it profit a man if he gains the whole world an loses or forfeits himself?" (verse 9:25).

Why We Do What We Do for Release Time Classes

This month I would like to share with you what we teach in Release Time classes and why. We run off copies of most of our materials instead of buying books to use. Why? Because so few schools have release time programs, there is not a lot of printed curriculum available. One option would be to use materials designed for Sunday school. Our Sunday School already uses one option available and another possible option was rejected after reviewing it. The books we used before were more of a devotional lesson that usually took about 20 minutes so they did not cover the full 45 minutes we have per class. Teachers had to come up with their own activities to fill the remaining time which made extra work for them.

Ruth Knaack and I, with the help of Pastor Heinecke, took the good things that worked from the lessons we had and formatted the material to be more visually friendly and interactive for kids. Then we added the best of the extra materials the teachers were using. Pastor Heinecke also supplied us with age appropriate material from Luther's Small Catechism and extra material for our 6th grade studies of Martin Luther and the Reformation. To this we added some memory work on the books of the Bible, Bible verses, the Lord's Prayer, Ten Commandments and the Apostles' Creed. Now our lessons fill the entire 45 minutes and everything is in one book. The teachers are happier which makes them better teachers; and better teachers make it more enjoyable and informative for the students. It also makes it easier for our substitute teachers.

Since we have done this, I need to run off the lessons each week and have them ready for the teachers to use. I do this very willingly and I know that all the teachers greatly appreciate it. This year Lois Just has graciously agreed to help me with this task and it has greatly decreased the number of hours I spend doing this. I believe that God has called me to do it and I am simply trying to do it to the best of my ability.

Here's a look at what each class is studying:

1st grade—Memorize the Lord's Prayer, John 3:16 and the New Testament books. They study Old Testament stories and make a few simple crafts throughout the year.

2nd grade—Does the same thing but they study New Testament stories.

3rd grade—Studies on overview of the Bible. At the beginning of the year each student receives a Bible.

4th grade—Memorizes the Old Testament books, the Apostles' Creed and the Ten Commandments while they study Old Testament stories.

5th grade—Does the same thing but with the New Testament.

6th grade—Memorizes the Apostles' Creed, Ten Commandments and a few select Bible verses while they study about Martin Luther and the Reformation.

7th grade—Studies Genesis and creation with materials put together by Pastor Neubauer.

8th grade—Studies current issues. They use material from Concordia Publishing House.

Our very dedicated teachers do their best to share the forgiveness and love of our Lord and Savior with these students each week. We have approximately 124 kids in two sessions. Most of our teachers teach both hours to keep this program running. This year, Faithbridge Church does not have 7th and 8th grade classes because of a lack of teachers. Pray that this does not happen at more churches in the area and the school decides to cancel all Release Time. In our church alone, that would be 124 children of God that no longer hear His word on Wednesday morning.

Sunday School – Connie Fondow/Melissa Koch would like to split class due to concerns of large size.

Preschool—38 students currently enrolled. (29-4 year olds, 9-3 year olds). There are five openings for the 4 year olds and one opening for the 3 year olds. State inspection is due anywhere from October — December. Seventeen of the children currently use the Heartland bus to facilitate either going to or from school. Seven of the children are on scholarship. Budget is being held at the same amount of \$16,500.00.

Adult Education – Classes are currently being held at various times and on various topics.

Pastor Report – Seven adults are currently attending the adult instruction class.



The first issue presented for discussion was the purchase of a TV for the confirmation classes. This purchase along with a previously approved amount of up to \$1200 for a projector will be paid from Richard Haberer annuity funds which has a balance of \$1,441.22.
