- P: Many of us love the Twenty-Third Psalm. We say it prayerfully in seasons of sorrow; recite its comforting words in periods of uncertainty; rehearse the assurance it offers for times of trial; But today we will let its words guide us in a time of confession.
- P: The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want.
- C: Am I content trusting that God is providing everything I need or am I always wanting more?
- P: He makes me lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside still waters; He restores my soul.
- C: Does my life show that in the waters of Baptism God poured out His promise of life to me, that His word can calm me and that Christ is my peace?
- P: He leads me in paths of righteousness for His name's sake.
- C: Would I be comfortable and even proud to have Jesus walking along with me everywhere I go?
- P: Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil; for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff they comfort me.
- C: Then why am I always looking elsewhere for comfort and protection? Why do I have so many fears?
- P: You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.
- C: Do I desire to be at His table, where He is both the Shepherd and the sacrificial lamb? Do I trust that He is blessing me to overflowing with His grace?
- P: Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

- C: Am I confident that God goes with me, confident that I will live with God forever?
- P: We confess together:
- C: Good Shepherd, You guide us in right paths, You lead us in the ways of righteousness, and invite us to rest in Your grace. Forgive us for not following Your ways. Forgive us for not remembering that we are Your sheep, and You are our Shepherd. Forgive us when we have not listened for Your voice and instead have acted in the ways of the world. Guide us back to Your path, to loving You and loving our neighbors. Amen.
- P: The Good Shepherd has laid down His life for the sheep who love to stray.
- C: By His wounds we are healed.

P: "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in His name." The Confession of Faith

Drawn from 1 Corinthians 15

C: We believe that Jesus Christ died for our sins; He was buried and He was raised to life on the third day. These things were spoken about by the Old Testament prophets. After His resurrection Jesus appeared to His followers at different times, including showing Himself alive to 500 of them at one time.
